

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
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CRIMINAL CAPITOL CRONIES

Dear Editor.


Read your Dad-dope-interview, and related in some degree ["The Austin Chronic: I Interviewed My Dad About Marijuana," Feb. 2]. I'm likely old enough to be your grandfather - plus. I was in college in the Sixties. I too, spent my career working medically underserved areas of Texas. I lived in Austin until it became an early version of the cesspool and insanity it is today.


I see a major difference in old vs. new dope. I "quit" in 1983. I claim the crews of two Panamanian freighters were put out of work as a result. My life changed. In five years. I was married to the wonderful lady I still am privileged to call "wife." And I was in medical training. Clearly, the life of doping was leading me nowhere.

Still. I say that marijuana back then was great fun. The socialization and interaction of sitting with friends and passing a joint was unparalleled in friendship, amusement, discovery, and cameraderie. I miss that.

I put "quit" in quotation marks because I tried the new stuff a couple of years ago. Similar to your Dad, I have a problematic nerve disease - an inherited demyelinating disease, and I can't tolerate narcotics - pain is preferable to the adverse responses. I found it to be vastly more potent than what we had back then, with a few notable exceptions.







Included in those few potency exceptions were the characteristics of the dope of the time - much laughter, relaxation, munchies with an enhanced enjoyment of flavors, increased enjoyment of friendships and a host of other elements which were absolutely absent in the new stuff.

Preserving Culture Through Our Parents' Cuisines

Inside the hawker centers in Singapore, I roamed around curious about which cuisine I wanted to taste while studying abroad. "Thai? Vietnamese? Indian? Chinese?" It reminded me of the array of food trucks back home in Texas where I would not only need to carefully choose a cuisine, but also a specific meal to eat. The familiar situation struck me in a foreign country so far away from home, but also gave me comfort in witnessing the global value of food. Growing up as a Vietnamese-American child of immigrants, food was our family's unifying force, but it had to meet our limited budget.

Interestingly, Singaporean hawker centers offer a cheaper and delicious option for meals when people are too busy to cook. However, this hawker culture is declining as older generations age and younger generations are looking to work in highskilled jobs. Singapore's increasing **BY TRISHTA** cost of living due to the influx of NGUYEN high-skilled workers has been a concern for residents. Many people in developed countries experience the challenge of finding time or energy to cook for themselves while earning a living. Texas is no exception.

Texas is the second-most diverse state in the U.S., with a large Hispanic/Latino and Asian population. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 40.2% of Texas' population is of Hispanic/Latino origin. Since Texas is diverse, it is important to preserve these cultures by learning recipes from family members, friends, or strangers. There is a rising risk of the loss of authentic foods in major cities, such as Austin, considerably due to the emphasis on high-skilled labor.

There is the race to achieve a high-skilled job to make a comfortable living, which I am currently facing as a college student. My immigrant parents tried their best to support me academically by cooking my meals until I moved out for college. They believed that as long as I could just focus on my studies, I would not need to care about how there was food on the table. Since I did not learn to cook Vietnamese recipes before living on my own, I cooked quick ready-made meals. While I studied and worked hard to achieve my dream high-skilled job, I sacrificed my health and craved my family's bamboo rice porridge or braised pork with quail egg. I felt ashamed for not learning about cooking recipes in and outside of my culture.

I discussed with my friends of various backgrounds the importance of preserving culture. My friends who are also children of immigrants acknowledged the cost of working a high-skilled job. It also led them to be less willing to cook the traditional meals they grew up eating. Generally, many Americans are resorting to buying ready-made or packaged foods, many of which are processed, containing high concentrations of salt and artificial ingredients.

I understand some people are unable to have the financial means or time to cook. Yet by preserving traditional recipes, it can help people actively be aware of their diets. Cooking also helps farmers, especially local Texas farmers, because the local fresh ingredients purchased can be used for different recipes. There are no rules in cooking since it depends on the cook's preferences and available resources. There is no shame in cooking a meal using substitutes to adapt to the environment.

Anyone can cook authentic meals by learning from cookbooks, searching online recipes and tutorials, using alternative

> ingredients, and participating in virtual or in-person cooking classes. One of the best ways to learn is to taste the food firsthand and engage with those who prepared the dishes, asking questions such as: "What ingredients did you use? How can I

find them? Can you teach me or provide me with your recipe?" The more questions asked, the longer these stories will live on. This is what food is - storytelling - and the way to continue it is to seek after it.

I encourage anyone reading this op-ed to learn new recipes of their own or new cultures. To keep a diverse society, combating the harsh consequences of development can be as minuscule as cooking for ourselves. Our careers do not determine who we are as humans; it is the identity we give ourselves, and culture is a part of it. Preserving the stories and flavors of authentic food helps us do so.

TROUBLE IN PARADISE: Texas House Speaker Dade Phelan, R-Beaumont, is in big trouble. Despite having overseen the passage of what even Gov. Greg Abbott touted as some of the most conservative bills in recent history, Phelan isn't far-right enough for some of Texas' GOP. The Texas Tribune reports. Divisions in the party became stark in 2023, with the House impeaching A.G. Ken Paxton and sinking Abbott's school voucher plan. Phelan is now up against the well-funded David Covey, an oil and gas consultant who supports the Texas secession movement.


OATH TO WIFE AND GOD: Phelan is not backing down against Paxton, though. In a new campaign ad, he says "Vengeful Paxton is the reason" **Donald Trump** endorsed Phelan's primary challenger. "If Paxton will break an oath to his wife and God, why would he tell Trump - or you - the truth?"

MAYORS TO SPARE: Austinites have another mayoral option. Doug Greco, former executive director of Central Texas Interfaith, announced his bid Monday. He's up against longtime former City Council Member Kathie Tovo and East Austin advocate Carmen Llanes Pulido. Mayor Kirk Watson hasn't formally announced, but says he intends to run.

SHIT SHOW: ... but in Austin, it's really the city manager who runs the (shit) show. Tuesday, the Austin American-Statesman reported that a city manager in Bozeman. Montana (with a population under 60,000), accidentally recorded himself telling a colleague that he was approached for the Austin job. "But they're a shit show," he said, before explaining the base salary was \$475,000.

After Sunday's statewide protest, a young man was attacked BY LINA FISHER

On Sunday, thousands traveled from across the state to rally for a cease-fire in Gaza. The second statewide protest organized by the **Austin for Palestine Coalition** drew an estimated 10,000-15,000 people to the south lawn of the Capitol. Nizar Doar, his

son Zacharia, and three friends had driven in from Dallas for the protest, and late on Sunday, Nizar was on his way back. "I just left my son in good condition. I told him. 'Let's go to Dallas, I will pay for your dinner, you and your friends, I want you to come

with us.' They're young, they decided to try the good food in Austin. They stayed. An hour and a half, hour and 45 minutes [into the drivel and I get a terrible call saying, 'Uncle, you have to turn back.""

BABIES HAVING BABIES: Following abortion bans in Texas, more than a decade of decline in the state's teen birth rate stopped and then turned into a modest increase, according to a new report from the University of Houston.

BORDER CONVOY DOES ITS THING: Sarah Palin and Ted Nugent headlined the "Take Our Border Back" rally in Dripping Springs last week ahead of their stop at the border, CBS Austin reported.

ABBOTT'S "INVASION": Activists aren't the only ones at the border. Abbott and 11 other Republican governors went to Eagle Pass Sunday for a show of force. Only two weeks ago Abbott invoked a clause in the U.S. Constitution that he claims gives governors the right to defend their states due to "invasion." Several of his

> counterparts have sent their state's National Guardsmen our way, the Statesman reported.

AI CAPITAL OF THE WORLD?: Al's on the rise here. UT-Austin announced last week that it's launching one of the most powerful artificial intelligence hubs in the academic world, called the Center for Generative AI. Meanwhile, last month Apple announced

it was closing the San Diego office where they focus on Siri and AI features and relocating more than 100 jobs to Austin, Axios reported.

SHUTTING DOWN: Easy Tiger, a bake shop and beer garden, announced it will close its East Seventh location at the end of April due to challenging weather conditions and increased costs. Easy Tiger's other locations will remain open.

Nizar's 23-year-old son Zacharia had been attacked and stabbed by 36-year-old Bert James Baker around 7pm as he and his friends were leaving the protest. At Nueces and West 26th Street, Baker allegedly approached their car on a bicycle and tried to rip a flagpole with a keffiveh scarf reading "Free Palestine" off the car, then screamed the N-word and pulled Zacharia from the car. The other three got out of the car to fight Baker off, who then allegedly stabbed Zacharia with a knife, breaking his rib. Zacharia underwent a successful surgery

In a press release Tuesday, APD called the incident "bias-motivated" and said it would be reviewed by the Hate Crimes Review Committee and then turned over to the District Attorney's Office. By Wednesday, APD announced that the Hate Crimes Review Committee indeed determined the case met the definition of a hate crime. It will be up to the District Attorney's office to make the final decision on enhancing the offense to a hate crime.

On Tuesday morning in front of City Hall, Nizar spoke at a press conference organized by the Dallas chapter of CAIR, the nation's largest Muslim civil rights organization. CAIR is calling for the incident to be investigated as a hate crime, both locally and federally. "Given the information collected and provided, it is clear that the hate was a motivating factor in the stabbing," said Hatem Natsheh with the Austin for Palestine

Coalition on Tuesday. "The surge in anti-Arab anti-Palestinian sentiment we are experiencing is unprecedented."

CAIR received 2,171 complaints of anti-Muslim and anti-Palestinian bias from Oct. 7 to Dec. 2, almost double the number reported during the same period a year ago. Speakers at the presser noted that the Austin incident echoes mounting violence in other American cities since Oct. 7, such as the October murder of a Muslim 6-year-old in Chicago and the November shooting of three Palestinian American college students in Vermont, who were wearing keffiyehs.

"Our city officials have created a climate of fear," said Zainab Haider, an organizer with the Austin for Palestine Coalition. "Many of them have been silent on Palestine. And now the silence of the mayor can only be seen as condoning this violence." (Watson's spokesperson had not responded to our request for comment as of our press deadline.)

Since October, advocates have been calling for City Council to adopt a cease-fire resolution, which it still has not, despite resolutions from the city's Human Rights Commission in November and the Asian American Quality of Life Advisory Commission in January.

> Council Members Zo Qadri, Vanessa Fuentes, and José Velásquez released a joint statement in December supporting a cease-fire, but in a January Council meeting, CM Chito Vela gave voice to a sentiment seemingly shared by many progressive officials – that he personally supports a cease-fire but does not want Council to "become embroiled in foreign policy matters."

> In light of Mayor Kirk Watson's October statement of support for Israel and Jewish Austinites, Joshua Sklar, a representative from Jewish Voice for Peace, said, "There's a very toxic notion that Jewish safety is somehow mutually exclusive with Palestinian, Arab, and Muslim safety. This notion is false. And I believe that our leaders have perpetuated it."

> Along with state Rep. Vikki Goodwin, Qadri attended the press conference, affirming support for the Palestinian community and saying he visited Zacharia in the hospital: "My biggest fear was if the violence was to come here to Austin, and we would see

folks in the Jewish community or Muslim community touched by this violence. That became a reality on Sunday night."

As he was driving back to Austin, Nizar said, "The first thing that came to my mind is 'I'm gonna lose my son.' He just had his baby - his wife - I was thinking, how am I going to tell them that I failed to protect my son. The city of Austin failed to protect my son. Greg Abbott failed to protect his citizens. Joe **Biden** failed to protect this country. This has come to haunt us in our homeland, in Texas. I beg you to call an end for this madness, and stop the genocide in Gaza."

PARD Considers the Future of Historic Home on Lady Bird Lake

TRAVIS HEIGHTS CITIZENS HAVE FOUGHT TO GET IT REHABBED FOR 40 YEARS

High on a bluff overlooking the Colorado River valley, an idyllic home once stood. It was an Arts & Crafts bungalow built by investor Ollie Norwood with symmetrical brick siding, large windows, hardwood floors, a low-pitched roof, and a pergola raised on pyramidal columns of river rock. Its doors opened onto rose gardens, a fountain, a greenhouse built into a hill, a tennis court, a gazebo, and a bathhouse with a large spring-fed geothermal pool.

But that was long ago. Little is left of the Norwood estate today. Only a few crumbling walls show where the outbuildings once stood. The pool was filled in as a safety hazard – an off-leash dog park sits over it now. The view from the property at I-35 and Riverside Drive is still there though, taking in Lady Bird Lake and the Downtown skyscrapers. Then there's the house itself, a stripped, wooden box behind a chain link fence, utterly unrecognizable.

Travis Heights resident Charlotte Bell told us the Norwood House was still beautiful as recently as the 1980s. That is when a group of neighbors cut a deal with a condo developer to designate the house a historic landmark to keep it from being bulldozed. The condo project fell through but not before the house was temporarily moved, causing its brick facade to collapse. The city purchased the lot in the Nineties, and the Women's Chamber of Commerce made plans to turn the house into a museum. They abandoned the project in 2000. By 2011, holes in the roof had let water ruin the hardwood floor and compromise the framing. The city's Parks and Recreation Department examined the house and recommended it be torn down.

At that point, a second generation of Travis Heights citizens sprang up, named themselves the Norwood Park Foundation, and convinced the city to let them rehabilitate the house. "The idea was for NPF and the city to combine private and public money to get this old house

back to its original appearance," said Bell's husband, Wolf Sittler. "Then it could be used as a publicly owned event space like the Zilker Clubhouse, another historic house with a gorgeous view that can be rented out."

NPF almost made that happen in 2021, after PARD allocated \$3 million for the project from bond and hotel tax revenue. The foundation got its design plans approved and secured the permits to begin work. But then, former NPF President Colleen Theriot said, the COVID pandemic suddenly drove construction prices up, doubling the cost of the project. Unable to raise the extra funds. NPF pulled out of the deal and dissolved in the summer of 2022, after 10 years of effort.

PARD told us it has moved the money for the Norwood House to other uses. The department proposed two options in a Jan. 25 memo: The city could take complete control of the property and create an event facility, as originally envisioned. Or it could remove the Norwood House's historic landmark designation, demolish it, and do something else with the site, like creating an overlook with exhibits describing what was once there.

PARD said it will make a recommendation in the fall. Kim McKnight, the department's manager of historic preservation, said their goal is to raise awareness of the options and open a dialogue with city leaders and citizens to see if there is enough will to re-create the old house.

PARD met with a new group of neighbors calling themselves the Revive Norwood Alliance on Jan. 30 as part of that outreach. Bell and Sittler were present and said PARD appeared open to going forward with the original plans. "Their position seemed to be that since someone is now advocating for the house they're more inclined to go with what the advocates want," Sittler said. "But the parks department has never been adequately funded. We need private money to get this done." - BRANT BINGAMON

City Manager Threatened to Quit Rather Than Meet With Council Over Acevedo Hire

The planned closed-door meeting never happened

Tension between City Council members and interim City Manager Jesús Garza over his surprise hiring of a widely detested former police chief for a new executive position may be loosening up for now, but City Hall sources tell the Chronicle that, just two weeks ago, Garza was threatening to resign rather than be subjected to a closed-door meeting about it.

The drama began at a private meeting between Garza and a subquorum of Council (CMs Natasha Harper-Madison, Ryan Alter, Paige Ellis, Zo Oadri, and Alison Alter) held Monday, Jan. 22. That was three days after news broke that Garza had offered Art Acevedo a high-ranking City Hall job but one day before Acevedo announced he would not take the job.

At the meeting with Garza, CMs were still reeling from a weekend of intense public backlash from community members concerned over Acevedo's appointment. They wanted answers from the manager about why Acevedo was chosen and, perhaps more importantly, how he was chosen.

The five CMs suggested holding an executive session at the next Council meeting, Feb. 1, to give all 11 CMs an opportunity to talk with the manager about the decision out of the public eye. Within City Hall, the discussion was being described as a "performance review" of the manager.

That description makes the discussion sound disciplinary in nature, but the CMs we talked to agreed that closed-door performance reviews don't always serve that function. They also provide a venue for CMs to have more candid conversations about policy, legal, and personnel issues - especially in terms of long-range planning. "We used to have these regular updates with the manager in executive session," Ellis told us, "whether it be quarterly or every six months. For me, it's just best practice. We should try to talk to the manager at least twice a year. It's just something we haven't done this past year."

Accounts of how exactly Garza threatened to guit differ, but one source said the manager told CMs he would "rather resign" than be called into executive discussion for a performance review. Whatever Garza's exact words were, the eight City Hall sources we talked to, all of whom had either direct knowledge of the situation or were briefed on it, say the manager's intent was clear: If Council continued to pursue the private performance review, he would quit.

When, on Jan. 23, Acevedo announced he was no longer interested in the new job Garza created for him, CMs still wanted to hold the executive session to discuss the final months of his tenure, as Council is ramping up to hire a new, permanent city manager sometime between April and June.

CMs in the subquorum met Thursday, Jan. 25, to hash out what they'd discuss with

Garza the following week. At that meeting, they decided to email Garza some questions ahead of time, signaling they weren't solely interested in taking him to task over the Acevedo decision. They also wanted insight into some of the initiatives he had been leading over the past year and how he planned to focus his efforts over the next few months.

Upon receiving the email, our sources say Garza quickly mounted a pressure campaign aimed at dissuading Council from placing the executive session item on their upcoming meeting agenda. Time was of the essence - he received the questions via email late Thursday afternoon; the deadline to make changes to Council's next meeting was the following day, Jan. 26. Garza would need to convince enough Council members to back off the idea by the next afternoon. So, Thursday night, he began calling them.

Ultimately, they were persuaded. On top of the resignation threat, some CMs feared attempts to hold the manager accountable could hurt the search for a permanent hire by making Council appear difficult to work with. Not only was the Feb. 1 executive session plan tossed, it's unclear if Garza will ever face one. We contacted each of the five members of the subquorum that initially sought the closed meeting; only CMs Alison Alter and Zo Qadri indicated openness to such a discussion.

"Oversight is a collective effort and I believe it is very valuable for us to be able to talk with one another especially when we are focused on goals of the future," Alter told us.

A private conversation with the manager could be appropriate, depending on the nature of the discussion, Qadri said. "Council and the public deserve clarity, communication, and transparency."

Garza did not respond to our questions about the sequence of events leading up to Council's decision to drop their proposed executive session review of his performance as city manager. Instead, through a spokesperson, he commented on the memo he issued in lieu of the private discussion. "The memo served as a way for the City Manager to share answers with the entire Council."

Absent an executive session discussion, Council will have to make do with the memo referenced in Garza's statement. In the memo, the manager provided a high-level overview of many initiatives the city has been working on, like homelessness response, efforts to improve police staffing, and climate resiliency.

To the one question about communication between the manager and Council – the root cause of the latest tensions between Garza and his bosses – he wrote, "While personnel and restructuring decisions are and should be at the discretion of the City Manager as set up by the charter, it in no way means that input is not welcome."



KEN PAXTON ATTACKS AUSTIN'S LENIENT MARIJUANA POLICY

Critics say it's a distraction from the A.G.'s legal woes

"What was Ken Paxton smoking when he filed this lawsuit?"

This was U.S. Rep. Greg Casar's reaction to the attorney general's Jan. 31 announcement that his office is suing Austin and four other Texas cities to reverse their policies decriminalizing marijuana possession.

Paxton heaped up old-fashioned War on Drugs bombast to publicize the lawsuit, describing mariiuana as "an illicit substance that psychologists have increasingly linked to psychosis." Referring to Austin and nearby San Marcos, Elgin, and Killeen, he said, "I will not stand idly by as cities run by pro-crime extremists deliberately violate Texas law and promote the use of illicit drugs."

Paxton's critics noted that his decrim lawsuit arrived on the same day that Travis County District Judge Catherine Mauzy denied the A.G.'s offer to settle a different suit: the ongoing 2020 whistleblower complaint against him alleging that he fired four of his top lieutenants after they told the FBI he was abusing his office. Paxton had offered to concede the truth of the allegations against him in the whistleblower lawsuit - while simultaneously maintaining his innocence. "Those seem to me to be contradictory positions." Mauzy said, rejecting the request.

Local advocates responded to Paxton's marijuana gambit with a mixture of amusement and disgust. Casar scoffed at the A.G.'s priorities, saying, "Local resources should go to keeping people safe, not chasing people down for low-level pot offenses. Our local policies are perfectly legal."

Casar led the effort to decriminalize marijuana as a member of Austin City Council in 2020. That summer, APD ordered officers to refrain from making arrests for marijuana possession alone. In 2022, 85% of Austin voters approved a formal ordinance enshrining the policy in city code. Arrests for possession of small amounts of marijuana have dropped significantly.

The Chronicle asked a city spokesperson if Paxton's lawsuit has caused interim City Manager Jesús Garza to issue guidance that police change their protocol for these arrests or if he had any plan to do so. The spokesperson did not directly answer, saying only, "We are aware of the lawsuit challenging Austin's policies related to low-level possession of marijuana."

Julie Oliver, executive director of Ground Game Texas, was one of Casar's allies in the decrim effort. She noted that propositions to decriminalize marijuana won supermajorities in the cities that Paxton is suing, including in San Marcos, where the proposal won 82% of the vote, Elgin (74%), Killeen (69%), and Denton (71%).

"This is an incredibly popular issue in every city where we've collected the signatures and put it on the ballot," Oliver said. "I'm surprised this is the hill that Ken Paxton wants to die on."

Oliver said that Paxton's lawsuit won't change the way cities handle marijuana possession anytime soon or affect the organizing that Ground Game Texas is doing in three more cities, where they expect success on marijuana decriminalization in upcoming elections. "The lawsuit is going to take years to play out through the courts." she said. "And in my opinion, this is an assault on democracy - the voters spoke. It is completely legitimate for a city to designate its own priorities."

San Marcos passed its marijuana decriminalization measure in November 2022, with social justice organizers Mano Amiga collecting signatures to get the measure on the ballot and encouraging a huge turnout, which wound up flipping many local offices from red to blue. The group's communications director, Sam Benavides, rejected Paxton's characterization of San Marcos citizens as "pro-crime extremists" and said the true radical is Paxton himself. "Paxton should focus on preparing for his own deposition for corruption rather than undemocratically defying the will of Texas voters," Benavides said. - BRANT BINGAMON

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Porcelain Infuses Noise Rock with "Realistic Ambition"

Intense quartet launches self-titled debut on Feb. 16

Anyone who's seen Porcelain live knows: Their music washes over you. Once singerguitarist Steve Pike gets his introductory merch-table-guiding spiel out of the way, there's no room for artist-audience banter. The band rips straight into a set of gnarly but melodic post-hardcore, complete with transitions and noisy soundscapes.

Out next Friday, Feb. 16, debut full-length Porcelain proves equally spellbinding. Transitions intact, its eight tracks flow into each other, presenting not just a collection of songs, but a curated body of work. On first listen, it's clear: These guvs are tight.

Indeed, "we give a shit," Pike confirms during an Epoch Coffee roundtable. "It's so easy just to be another Austin band and [sav]. 'Oh, we're gonna go play Hotel Vegas three times a month ... but that's such a limitation when you just want to play one city and be big in one city."

"There's really nothing wrong with aspiring to that," drummer Eli Deitz interjects. "But we want to do more."

Guitarists Pike (Exhalants, Carl Sagan's Skate Shoes) and Ryan Fitzgibbon (TV's Daniel, US Weekly), bassist Jordan Emmert (Super Thief, Pleasure Venom), and drummer Deitz (Votive, Shitbag, Dregs) had long known each other from their other bands, but started playing together two years ago.

"We really hit the ground running," Emmert says. After their

first show in May 2022, the group showcased at South by Southwest the next spring, followed by debut single "C.O.A." Their first LP arrives via Portrayal of Guilt Records, placing Porcelain alongside industrial rockers Nuclear Daisies on the metal heavy hitters' limited - nay, selective - label roster. Based on a claustrophobic Portrayal of Guilt Records showcase last month at Chess Club, the partnership comes with a built-in audience.

Riding "a good, healthy amount of realistic ambition," according to the bassist, they recorded the album over five days last year, but spent months perfecting its mix and track list. Two songs were axed in order to fit "History," a 10-minute critique of a cyclical society that devolves into an improvised swirl of feedback. The outro changes in nearly every live performance.

"That's my moment where I can really go for it and feel cathartic and get a lot of emotion out," says Fitzgibbon, who also tours on guitar with UK cumbia punks Los Bitchos. "I'll bang my guitar, rub a freakin' beer can all over the strings, make some crazy noises, mess with my pedals. I love that. I find that very fun and therapeutic."

Penultimate track "Invoices" checks another group favorite. Inspired by the "mindnumbing warehouse jobs" that Pike, a live sound engineer, took when concert venues shuttered during the pandemic, the song trudges along to mirror the "punch in, punch out" mentality of working-class life. It also draws from another universal, existential crisis-inducing milestone: turning 30.

"I recognize that the best day of my life's gone/ So wave goodbye," Pike sings, taking stock of his life so far. As he goes to repeat his

farewell, the zombie walk ends, and the band crashes in for a last-minute headbanger's throttle. Naturally, it's another live highlight.

"I always look at the crowd whenever we're playing that song," Fitzgibbon says, throwing up devil horns to describe what's reflected back. "It's got a lot of girth to it."

Sonic intensity aside, the band packs a sense of humor. Before each set, they walk onstage to remarkably goofy compositions, from the narration of the FitnessGram Pacer Test to songs by 311 and Puddle of Mudd. "It's not slowed and reverb," Deitz, the mastermind behind the bit, insists of the edits. "It's chopped and screwed. It's not Zoomer shit. It's Houston shit."

The "vibe setter" offers a sort of pre-show levity, Pike says. His lyrics reveal personal traumas, but his performances don't dwell on them. "We're talking about some really real shit," the singer admits. "We can all have some sort of catharsis about it together,

> On release day, Porcelain takes the piss alongside alexalone and Cherubs, a stellar who's who of Austin noise. Emmert cites the latter as his introduction to the genre, while Pike hails alexalone as one of the most underrated artists in the local scene. The gig also kicks off an upcoming East Coast tour,

Porcelain's biggest run to date and first journey to the region. Fitzgibbon speaks excitedly about playing in Toronto - "We're leaving the country!" she squeals – while Pike points out shared dates with Ontario natives Life in Vacuum. It's the logical next step for a band whose ambitions are, really, not that lofty.

"Just being a working-class band - that's all I would like to do," Pike says. "We're not just in it to be popular or the next big thing in Austin. We're here because we need to make music ... so why not? If I'm going to spend this much time doing it, why not be fucking good at it?"

CROSSTALK

Mike & the Moonpies have officially changed their name to Silverada. The country quintet, formed by singer-songwriter Mike Harmeier in 2007, announced the news in a social media statement last month, "The band has accomplished some incredible things and progressed immensely over the past decade and a half, musically and personally, and we now feel our old name does not reflect who we are or the art we are creating currently," they wrote. The group will continue to perform their back catalog, and will officially debut as Silverada with a self-titled album due June 28.

How Richard Samuel Turned an Art Gallery Into a Community Center

RichesArt launches annual Black History Month exhibit with new philanthropic initiative

hite walls, fluorescent lights, the occasional "keep your distance" line of tape on the floor: Most art galleries present one of life's greatest pleasures – witnessing artistic creations up close – with a healthy dose of restrictions. Keep quiet, and keep your hands to yourself.

Stepping into RichesArt Gallery, you don't tense up with that same anxiety. Hues of blue and red illuminate the East Sixth Street space. Luscious green plants decorate the walls not already adorned with art. In lieu of silence – or, worse, inoffensive adult contemporary – neo-soul and melodic hip-hop reverberates.

The biggest difference? RichesArt visitors can do more than spectate. The art gallery – founded by artist Richard Samuel in 2021 – is open to the public from Friday through Sunday, but during the week, it becomes an event space, home to watercolor painting, figure drawing, and collage making classes, as well as comedy shows, jazz performances, and poetry readings.

Of course, an art gallery needs art buyers, and these activities bring people in the door. But Samuel wants

his visitors to do more than purchase the art. He wants them to "network, talk, imagine, be curious."

Turns out, networking, talking, imagining, and being curious are the building blocks of a community. In the past three years, RichesArt – which until 2023 was the only Black-owned art gallery in Austin – has become a third place: a gathering spot outside of work and home for people to hang out. It's also

become a launching pad for creatives of color. On Feb. 3, the gallery opened its third annual Black History Month exhibit, "American History: Elevate," which displays the work of six local Black artists.

Heike Blakley, one of the artists involved in the exhibit, has lived in Austin for five years, but she's rarely encountered arts institutions that have supported her work. Most galleries don't understand the Black and brown communities, and they aren't trying to improve. "They're just not open to a different brand of what they already have," she says. "And honestly, it's boring."

RichesArt offers a welcome change of pace. "It's exactly what I would imagine an art gallery feeling like," Blakley says.

Cliff Bunn, 62, moved to Texas in 2014 after retiring from the Oakland Police Department. Living in Georgetown, he says, "I don't have a community of artists or a lot of other Black people. So [when] I heard about RichesArt Gallery, I couldn't wait to get there." Upon his arrival, he introduced himself to Samuel, told him he was an artist, and hoped to submit his work to the gallery. "American History: Elevate" marks his fourth RichesArt collaboration.

"It feels like a family atmosphere," Bunn says of the space.

Samuel, 35, grew up in Wimberley, a town about 40 miles southwest of Austin whose population has yet to breach 3,000. He grew up playing football and earned a full-ride scholarship to play the game at Texas Southern University, but wasn't recruited by the NFL. Instead, he went on to represent America in international competitions before joining teams in Serbia and Germany.

The whole time, art was Samuel's other main interest – "my peace," as he puts it. "It was like a yin and a yang," the owner recalls. "I would go to football practice, I'd come home, I'd paint."

Though he followed an athletic career path, Samuel attended poetry nights, jazz shows, and art galleries as a kid, which meant becoming an artist never felt out of his grasp. His mother, Christa, even preferred he pursue that goal instead of football

and bought him art supplies "left and right."

"I think [she] had a heart attack every time I was on the field because of the collisions," Samuel reasons, laughing. "So half that decision might have been to save her own stress, like, 'Please do something nicer!""

Christa's support went beyond providing materials. During her son's senior year of high school, she signed him up for a watercolor workshop led by Lian Quan Zhen, the esteemed Chinese artist who's taught at the University of California, Berkeley and authored several books. Samuel missed a week of school to attend the class.

"It was like every lightbulb went off in my head as a kid, watching this guy create this art," he recalls. "And I've been obsessed with watercolor ever since."

He continued to create during his professional football career and sold original pieces even before retiring from the game in 2018. Once free from football, Samuel adapted Zhen's watercolor curriculum and began teaching classes of his own.

"Everything was going great," Samuel remembers. "And then I got a head coaching job for a team overseas."

The athlete always expected to transition to coaching once he stepped off the field, so he accepted the offer and headed back to Germany. But "I was miserable," he reveals. "I hated it."

In March of 2021, after working for four months as an offensive coordinator for the Ingolstadt Dukes, Samuel accepted that, maybe, art had topped football on his list of priorities once and for all. He returned to Texas and, using his pandemic-era Paycheck Protection Program loan, began seeking a brick-and-mortar to host his water-color classes. In a stroke of "crazy luck," he found the East Sixth Street space listed on Craigslist for the exact same amount as the loan.

"I guess I'm opening an art gallery."


"THERE WAS NO PLAYBOOK"

Progressing from artist to art curator is a big jump as it is, but when RichesArt first opened, Samuel was also organizing all of the gallery's events himself. "That was probably the biggest thing that I had issues with – there was nobody that has done anything like what I was doing here, around Austin," he says. "Obviously [I practiced]

networking and building community [and] started meeting people that helped elevate the space, but there was no playbook."

These days, Samuel delegates the organizing of RichesArt events to a handful of collaborators. He teaches the gallery's watercolor and figure drawing classes, Steven Ecker leads its collage making workshops, and Destini Cook offers modeling advice. On the entertainment side, Galen Ford teaches an art history lecture series, Markieth Bolen books jazz shows, and Savannah Marie and Jonathan Ezemba organize recurring poetry slams.

Samuel also rents out the gallery for external events, which has become a substantial source of income. Likening the structure to a "Robin Hood" scenario, the owner explains, "We do five, six of those a month [in order to] pay the bills, and then we're able to have all these classes and intentional things for either free or at a very low cost." Tickets to most art classes go for \$30 to \$45, while performance events run from \$15 to \$50.

Samuel was Austin's first Black art gallery owner, but he wasn't the first artist who resolved to diversify the city. Photographer Steve Hatchett moved here from Chicago in 2017 to become director of career services at Huston-Tillotson University. Upon his arrival, he noticed the city's whitewashed art scene and founded Of Color, an alliance dedicated to uplifting Black and brown artists.

In its infancy, the organization hosted pop-up events before moving on to curate days-long affairs like Black Art WKND and Latino Art WKND. Hatchett met Samuel at an Of Color event where the latter was a vendor. "I remember him just having that energy," Hatchett says of the artist. "Folks just wanted to be around him ... And now he has grown an institution that we all admire."

Of Color opened its own art gallery, OFC Creatives, last year. Hatchett looks to Samuel for inspiration. "We share resources, we share ideas, we share bread, we share company, we share strategies to grow and amplify the work that we're both doing," the former explains.

AMERICAN HISTORY

Why "American History"? Why not, say, "Black History"? Samuel's choice of name for his gallery's Black History Month exhibit was deliberately all-encompassing. Black culture is American culture, he explains, and Black folks' contributions to American society are among the most consequential and unsung of its entire history.

The founder likens past "American History" exhibits to Irish bars; like those watering holes, the shows were open to all demographics as an opportunity to appreciate a specific way of life. Less about celebration, this year's show comes with a more intentional premise. "American History: Elevate" steps away from the past and looks to the future. Paring down from 30-odd artists to just six, the show highlights local Black creatives with a catch: In exchange for displaying their work, each participant must do something good for the community.

Partnering with local businesses, RichesArt will present each artist with a \$500-1,000 grant that they must pay forward, from buying a student's books to teaching an art class. Samuel hopes the initiative will create a foundation for Austin's next generation of artists to thrive.

"The people we give honor to in the past and the flowers we give them – they were us at one time," he explains. "We want to be the history that we want to create."

Though the pieces in the "Elevate" exhibit are united by a Black history theme, each artist's work reflects their personal style. Bunn typically presents his political values front and center - a standout piece, which emulates Black hair by reclaiming the derogatory term "nappy," hangs 24/7 in RichesArt - but the series he submitted for this show provided an emotional reprieve.

The artist painted portraits of Black boxers, from Joe Louis and Sugar Ray Robinson to Muhammad Ali and Mike Tyson. He's most eager to discuss Jack Johnson, who became the first Black heavyweight champion in 1908. Johnson's win incited race riots across the country, but as the artist notes, he never apologized for his success. In fact, Johnson signaled his wealth via flashy clothes and business ventures, and openly dated and married white women in the midst of Jim Crow. Incorporating elements of collage, Bunn elevated his illustration of the athlete with newspaper clippings from the era, which described Johnson in racist caricatures.

Despite a longtime interest in art, Bunn didn't pursue the practice seriously until after his retirement. He graduated from UT-Austin with a BFA in studio art in 2020. where he learned that many public school art teachers must purchase their own supplies for their classrooms. He plans to donate his "Elevate" scholarship to the cause at low-income schools in his home of Georgetown.

Abstract artist Hailey Gearo met Samuel in 2021 and has participated in several RichesArt shows, including the first "American History" exhibit. But as she tells the Chronicle, her output has evolved to reflect her interest in storytelling – especially when it comes to her journey with bipolar disorder. Titled Worlds, the dreamscapes she's showing in this year's exhibit represent cyclical modes of being: bright colors populate what she calls her manic "phantasmal" state, while splatters and dots of muted tones signal depressive episodes. The series originated from a need for self-expression, but Gearo hopes to ignite wider conversations about mental health, especially in the Black community, where such vulnerability remains a taboo.

She's inspired some conversations already. "Women of color, I've noticed, do this a lot," Gearo begins. "They will read my artist statement and then look at whatever pieces they might be looking at, and then they'll come over quietly and just say, 'Thank you for sharing.' And then just disappear."

It's sweet and sad, Gearo says. "[It's] one of those quiet glances that I feel like so many women have with each other So much of our communication is just seeing and being received in a very subtle manner."

Meanwhile, the men who view Gearo's work are moved to share their own emotions. "They are so conditioned to not feel or be expressive of their feelings, especially things that are outside of anger, because anger seems to be the easiest or most acceptable form for so many men to feel," the artist posits. "And so having these really vulnerable moments with them is always really beautiful and also very inspiring [for] me to continue to put myself out there."

On the other end of the thematic spectrum, Of Color founder Hatchett submitted a photography series that depicts Black life and, most importantly, Black joy. He memorializes weddings and concerts; in one photo, two men get down on the dance floor, while in another, folks do the limbo. In modern America, where Black death is projected on 24-hour news programs and Hollywood reaps historical oppression to create Oscar-bait dramas, Hatchett's candids offer a glimpse into normal Black life, down to the minutiae that make us human beings.

Equally striking are the photographer's portraits, which reveal just as much about their subjects. In one shot, a woman bends over laughing, exposing the braces that match her Beyoncé-inspired chrome top. In another, shot in black-and-white, two women lean their heads together; one looks at the camera.

while the other closes her eyes. Devoid of airbrushing, you can see the texture of their skin.

Artist and fashion designer DaProphet's paintings are similarly positive. His work draws on a collective Black experience, "from watching Soul Train to eating at Waffle House on Sundays," he says. "My hope is to bring back nostalgia."

DaProphet's images of Black Power fists and games of cards and dice

instantly evoke Black culture, but his Waffle House painting will invoke a particularly visceral reaction in a very specific demographic. Miraculously, the piece turns the beloved, albeit chaotic, Southern breakfast chain into something of a blissful Monet scene. The black-and-white tiled floor, those cherry red barstools, the jukebox, a couple wrapped around each other: It's all there, depicted with blurred brush strokes. Reader, DaProphet has taken the most care in depicting Waffle House since Anthony Bourdain's impassioned Parts Unknown monologue.

Samuel, always the optimist, can already imagine how a future Austin will benefit from the "Elevate" exhibit, which runs until March 24. "Maybe 10 years from now, [we'll] have three different programs that we can all translate back to 'American History: Elevate,'" he says. "And at that point, we're creating the history that we want to see, creating the culture we want to see, creating the world we want to see. And," he says again, "making history."

TILL DEATH GIVE US ART

Walking through the spacious maze that is RichesArt, you find more rooms – and more Samuel projects. Right off the main space, which hosts the gallery's art classes and entertainment shows, is a gift shop, where prints of Samuel's work and clothes from his fashion line are up for sale.

Did we not mention his fashion line?

Rich Prophet is a collaboration between Samuel and DaProphet. The former describes the business as "upcycled high fashion street fashion" - consisting of altered pieces of existing clothing, to clarify the mouthful. Imparting a casual streetwear vibe onto more professional clothing, the line features a lot of modified suits: Samuel paints graffiti-esque designs on the back of sport coats, many of which have been cut into short sleeves.

There aren't a ton of clothes for sale in the gift shop, but during the gallery's open hours, fashion fiends can find Rase House, a vintage store tucked in the very back of the building that's operated by Christa.

Samuel's mother. Turns out Richard wasn't the only person in his family with a creative eye.

Now that he's used every inch of his building's 3,600 square feet, Samuel readies an expansion. Officially open today, Feb. 9, on East Cesar Chavez Street, RichesArt Studios touts photography rooms and a podcasting studio, offering a creation space to its ever-growing network of artists. Even without a playbook, the

artist has clearly done something right.

"As someone that has been able to hold that community space and expand, I've just been in awe of [Samuel's] ability to move and create, and do it in a very organic way that few artists before him have been able to do," Hatchett says. "Especially at a young age."

Samuel sums up his determination with his slogan, sold on gallery merchandise and projected into the space via light-up sign: "Till Death Give Us Art."


A trademarked spin on marriage vows seems especially fitting for an artist clearly married to his work. "It's a lifestyle," Samuel says, "You go back and you look at your life and the things that you did and [what] brought life into your world or inspired you or made you light up, and so much of it is art-related."

In other words? "I can lead, and leave, a happy life if I know that I was constantly creating."



ANDY, or: The Four Horsegirls

of the Apocalypse

Cheer Up Charlies

Where can you turn when things don't look quite the way you imagined? When expectations shift, dreams are deferred, and people disappear?

For Jammy Violet, bandleader of ever-evolving pop project Pelvis Wrestley, a persistence of vision and radical creativity provide meaning in an indecipherable realm. Out on Valentine's Day, Pelvis Wrestley's wildly inventive second LP - ANDY, or: The Four Horsegirls of the Apocalypse – sees Violet embrace impermanence with open arms, putting the performer's gift for queer world-building on full display. Their new release serves as a part-literal, part-fantastical reflection on

loss, centered around the mythology of an all-consuming demigod named Andy.

"Andy is a divine amalgam of all missing persons," summarizes Violet. "The basic story is that Andy is somebody that went missing, and then has

become deity-ized and achieved a god status, where other people that go missing are absorbed into Andy.

"All stories of missing people could be said to be about Andy, but then Andy also becomes a place of comfort in being lost. 'The House of Andy' is a big thing in the mythology – it's this place that's outside this world, where you can find yourself."

Violet began developing the concept in the early 2010s, filling journals with chronicles of the divine being. Inspired in part by real-life missing persons cases observed during high school and college, the self-construction also acted as a haven for the young queer Texan while under the constrictions of Christian schooling.

"I was coming into understanding my queerness for the first time, and having that really rub up against the religious identities and ideologies that I was raised with," explains Violet, "I stopped knowing how to think of myself as a good or worthy person.

"I just felt so horrible about myself, and my survival project was to build a religious ideology that I knew how to be good within. It was a real life raft."

For an album anchored in impermanence, Pelvis Wrestley certainly manages to have fun. As pastoral woodwinds supplement the celestial opening chords of lead-off hymn "Found a Friend,"

listeners find themselves fully immersed in a world of high-concept pop eclecticism. Bouncing from the wacky Eightiesinspired synth of "No One You Know" to infectious baroque dance-along "Holy Host," the experimenter skirts around structures with glee. While still leaning

into the twangy instrumentation of past releases, Violet notes a distinct shift from country-focused first album Vortexas Vorever.

"The concept of making country music was very important to the first record in a way that it's not important to this one," explains Violet, who cites Patsy Cline and June Carter Cash as major inspirations on Bandcamp. "This record is less focused on the form, because the form is pretty scattered."

With ANDY, Violet shifts their attention to a pantheon of genre-bending deities: "I was more focused on some broader pop icons that I hold in my heart - your Kate Bushes, your Perfume Geniuses, your Nina Hagens, Bjorks, and Enyas." Read the full version of this story online. - GENEVIEVE WOOD

DAY TRIPS

The Sculpture Zoo in Waco invites visitors to get up close and personal with the animals.

Along a mile-long stretch of the hike-and-bike trail on the south bank of the Brazos River through downtown Waco are 28 artworks by 17 artists of animals either found in the city's Cameron Park Zoo or native to Central Texas. The sculptures range from the whimsical to the ferocious.

Although most joggers and walkers on the sidewalk seem oblivious as they pass the menagerie, everyone seems to have a favorite.

The Wise Elephant must be one of the top favorites. The large bronze African elephant by Arizona artist Trevor O'Tool sits on a bench contemplating the world much like Rodin's Thinker.

A few steps down the trail is a bronze sculpture called Ely Playing with a Stick by **Meg White** of Indiana. This artwork has a backstory of a real-life elephant calf who was born

Mother-and-child bonding is a common theme expressed by the sculptures. Lioness With Cubs by Australian Tom Tischler is a feel-good piece, while Razak and Auntie, made of steel and concrete by artists Solomon Bassoff and Domenica Mottarella of California, depicts two orangutans that live in Cameron Park Zoo with a heartwarming story of a surrogate mother and the return of the mother-child relationship.

The Waco Sculpture Zoo is along the south bank of the Brazos River's hike-and-bike trail, beginning just west of Washington Avenue and running west to Cameron Park. There are several turnouts for short-term parking along North University Parks Drive and a large parking lot at the western end of the Sculpture Zoo near the entrance to Cameron Park, one of the largest city parks in Texas with over 20 miles of trails, playgrounds, picnic areas, and the Cameron Park Zoo. 

Take a Look; It's in a Book

Celebrating Black queer Austin is a task taken on by a fair number of local orgs but not nearly enough to fully emphasize the contributions Black LGBTQ folks make to the city's scene. Having noticed the gap themselves, members from several Austinbased groups including What's in the Mirror, allgo, and Kind Clinic came together in 2023 to create Pride in Black ATX. The objective, as stated jointly by Kind Clinic's Joe Anderson Jr. and South by Southwest's Sonita Haynes, was to "create something new and fresh that was centered around Blackness and Queerness and creating safe spaces in ATX."

From a week of Black queer functions last Austin Pride to an ode to queer hip-hop during November 2023, Pride in Black ATX has drawn from Austin's well of Black talent for their events. This month, however, they'll be kicking off a new venture: the Black Queer Book Club. Originating from conversations shared during Thanksgiving, Anderson Jr. and Haynes say the idea came around because of the book club's first pick: bell hooks' All About Love: New Visions.

As the first volume in hooks' trilogy "Love Song to the Nation," the book explores what love is and how its misapplication has led to a polarized society. Appropriate for February both for its subject and its author, Haynes and Anderson Jr. point to hooks' newest work as "the perfect way to start" the book club. "We wanted to start with a Black Queer woman," they say, "and essentially we were all reading it or interested in reading it."

Future lit picks will continue the trend of highlighting Black queer authors, and suggestions from book club participants will be happily noted, according to Anderson Jr. and Haynes. Focusing on contemporary writers, they say, will bring the texts into readers' own stories and experiences – a commingling of art and real life. Attendees may sign up for the book club through Pride in Black ATX's Instagram (@prideinblackatx) and should be sure to bring their most authentic selves to the discussion. "Ultimately," Anderson Jr. and Haynes say, "we want people to feel comfortable diving into the intersections of their identities through fun, fellowship and family."



Cheek Gets a Check

Hilarious gay people take note: **Tongue in Cheek**, that local queer open mic comedy night at **Swan Dive**, received a grant from the city of Austin's **Cultural Arts Division**. A Romance to Savor



The Taste of Things is an utterly charming love story between two middle-aged chefs in 19th-century France by Richard WHITTAKER

From its English-language title, French-Vietnamese filmmaker Trần Anh Hùng's The Taste of Things (La passion de Dodin Bouffant) could be presumed to be about flavors. But the reality of the new film from the director of The Scent of Green Papava is that it is about time. The hours spent by gourmet Dodin (Benoît Magimel) and his cook, Eugénie (Juliette Binoche), in the kitchen, preparing sumptuous feasts for his guests. The two decades they have spent as lovers. The torn calendar pages of their age. And, in the lengthy, almost wordless opening sequence, the time it takes to cook a meal in a late 19th-century kitchen, to build up levels of flavor and texture, to treat ingredients with the delicacy or strength required. In that scene, Trần resets the audience's internal clock to a moment before our own rush-rush era.

That cooking sequence is a slow, warm, delicate dance filled not just with delicious visions of roasts, pies, stews, and desserts, but with character and relationships. It's a scene that subtly unveils the dynamics of Dodin and Eugénie's relationship, one that has the subtle comforts of a well-worn pan that still cooks better than anything fresh from the market.

Trần's script (very loosely adapted from Marcel Rouff's 1924 novel La vie et la passion de Dodin-Bouffant, gourmet) isn't simply an ode to the idea of food being the food of love. Instead, it's an utterly charming and touching description of a tender relationship between two people in middle age. Foolish childhood passions are long gone, replaced with that glow that combines both comfort and perpetual yearning. Moreover, Binoche and Magimel are of ages that imply that their 20-year bond was not entered into in the flush of youth. Indeed, Trần plays with great delicacy on the fact that the actors were romantically involved for several years - not in an exploitative way, but as an emotional underpinning. It's rare to see characters who are supposed to have years of intimacy built up between them depict those connections and familiarity convincingly, but Binoche and Magimel fill every quiet moment with those subtexts. Whether it's as they pass ingredients in the kitchen, watch the evening descend from the lawn of his countryside home, or as he steals into her bedroom on a night in which she leaves the door unlocked, nothing need be said.

Of course, change does come, but again Trần keeps harsh or bitter tastes out of his recipe, even in the midst of tragedy. Yet there is nothing saccharine, as every moment is delivered with the subtle warmth of fresh honey, meaning they can bicker without the scene collapsing into a Marriage Story-esque meltdown or French New Wave laconic cruelty.

Inevitably, food is also an essential part of the film, and rarely has cooking and its resultant concoctions been so evocatively presented in any art form. But Trần doesn't depend on glamour shots of elaborately stuffed this or braised that. The cooking – with its sticky, muddy, bloody raw ingredients all handled by the actors rather than Le Cordon Bleu-trained doubles - may evoke similar scenes in Gabriel Axel's equally

heartwarming Babette's Feast. Yet the meals themselves are more talked of than shown. given a significance in description only matched by novelist James Joyce's setting of the Christmas feast in "The Dead." Such descriptions can evoke feelings from deep affection to humor, the latter expressed in Dodin's scarcely suppressed biliousness at a menu designed for admiration, not consumption.

Both those earlier stories are ingredients in Trần's story, and combine for an ending that speaks to both the novella's sense of lost time and the film's depiction of an act of extraordinary kindness. It's an ending that can only come from the truest understanding between two adults. La nourriture, c'est l'amour, c'est la vie.

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Nômadé Is a Tropical Dining Destination

Experience a melting pot of flavors at this Yucatán-inspired oasis BY JESSI CAPE

Finally entering my travel era, I've so far only made the acquaintance of one real jungle - the tropics of Dominical, Costa Rica. My big life plan includes trips to everywhere, but in the interim, the promise of a restaurant founded by "wanderers" and inspired by their travels feels like a targeted draw. I'm also a sucker for beautiful photos of dreamy oases. Nômadé, a new dedicated gluten-free eatery focused on the flavors of Yucatán, offers a vibrant destination outside our usual spaces.

Situated near Elizabeth Street Cafe, on the corner of Monroe and South First, there is a small parking lot in the back, an adjacent paid garage, and occasionally some space on the street if you're lucky. Once you pass the transportation hurdles and make it to Nômadé, depending on your seat selection, the vibe can be the lovely "escape to a jungle oasis" it aims to be. It can also feel a little squeezed, more trendy-must-try than kick-back-relax.

"Wander-ins" are accepted, but on both times, I was glad we had rezzies - first, inside the casita, and second, outside on the patio. I'm not entirely sure which it was called - the Garden, Cabana, Terraza, or Cantina - but by a landslide we preferred that covered outdoor area over the revamped home interior, a tiny space on sensory overload. On the upside, Nômadé's interior is gorgeous: Black leather accents contrast all sorts of natural and stained woods: carved stone tchotchkes perk up each table. Everywhere you look, there are subtle details of terra cotta, smooth concrete, matte black, gray gravel, intriguing straw, and bamboo. Beautiful lush greenery is a central theme, and like their thriving plants, the restaurant is full of life.

Let's get to the food. As a wheat-free diner, it is a mix of relief and excitement to know I can order anything on this menu without any concern of cross-contamination. Nômadé,

which opened in October 2023, is a dedicated gluten-free restaurant, safe even for celiacs, they say. With a severe pineapple allergy, it's a bit more precarious. Pineapple is rich in bromelain, an enzyme largely thought to assist digestion for those with gluten issues, assuming of course, you're not anaphylactically allergic to the popular tropical fruit. Pineapple is all over the menu here, but staff is tuned into dietary restrictions and kindly, expertly accommodated me on both visits. Always, always inform your server about your allergy stuff.

Nômadé's flavor profile is described as inspired by the diversity of Yucatán, Mexico's cuisine, which includes many bold spices found in Lebanese, Portuguese, and African fare. Their huge wood-fired grill scents the air and both food and drink; the raw seafood bar boasts a super-fresh bounty from the Gulf of Mexico. Nômadé is owned by the same folks as Lucky Robot Japanese Kitchen, a SoCo



restaurant dedicated to sustainable seafood offerings. For us ocean-minded shrimp lovers, this is a huge selling point. Alternately, the veggie dishes are just as compelling as the meaty selections. (Upon arrival, a plant-based menu - instead of, or in addition to, one that continues meat - is offered.) The teams are knowledgeable and efficient, and if service was a little wobbly during our first occasion, by the second visit the team had found their sea legs.

Right off the bat, I had my sights set on eating a helluva lot of flatbread since I hadn't had any for over a year. Very interestingly, the difference in their flatbread situation was a drastic change between our visits. The first coconut flatbread iteration was incredible: delicious and warm and fluffy with the perfect chew. We enjoyed it on its own, and also dipped into the Mayan-inspired sikil pak, a hummus-esque puree of pepitas, this one dotted with tangy blistered cherry tomatoes. I absolutely devoured it and requested extra to horf down at home.

Our second-visit flatbread experience was, quite literally, a flat letdown. Coconut flatbread was on-menu but not available; instead it was a guajillo version that landed with a thud. Feeling comfortable with our down-to-earth server, I inquired about the deflation: Is it different every time? Why is it so heavy now - more Eeyore than Winnie the Pooh? A gluten-free flatbread is very tricky - subject to changes in weather, technique, oven temp fluctuation. etc., he said. Late last year, Nômadé's recipe was made with rich coconut milk, but it was incredibly inconsistent, so they nixed it. Now it's a combo of tapioca, rice flour, and masa, resulting in a much denser, but apparently more consistent, flatbread. We can buy predictably sad flatbread anywhere - bring back the delightful coconut flatbread magic, please.

The bar menu is smart and heavily centered on agave concoctions. La Antigua boasts both tequila and smoky mezcal, enhanced with orange and a twinge of mole, served in a covetable crystal lowball with a textured rainbow motif. My favorite was the BanJaJa, a happy cocktail featuring coconut fat-washed Lalo tequila, charred banana, and crème de banana, which was somehow not too banana-y. We really enjoyed the habanero heat in both the K'uk'ulkan and El Yucatecan, and were sur-

prised to find an interesting bittersweet floral combination in the gin-based fuchsia Jamaica Fizz. Being Damp January, I'd hoped to try a zero-proof bev, but they were out. On both visits there was a notable lack of available food and drink menu items. Some nights

you simply run out of popular dishes – and that can be a good thing with food waste concerns in mind. But when multiple items from every menu section are 86'ed at 7pm on a Friday, someone's planning math is off.

The Tikin Xic daily catch was a meaty swordfish, grilled and topped with tomato confit, pickled red onion, and xnipec (like a habanero pico), on top of mogo-mogo – a new-to-me side of mashed plantain – and wrapped in banana leaf. Loved it. I've avoided eating cephalopods since 2020's My Octopus Teacher, but I caved and ordered the charred pulpo. Not an easy protein to cook, they nailed the texture here – crisped exterior and soft inside – so good. If anything, the elote recado negro and escabeche had some salt inconsistency. Leaning into the fresh seafood,

you cannot go wrong with the eye-catching tuna crudo, served in a fun coconut half-shell; yummy and bright, the aguachile and ceviche were a big hit. Usually battered-and-fried is off-limits for gluten-freers, but not if it's masa batter, as with the crispy jaiba frita (masa-fried soft-shell crab).

A major standout was the wonderful, deeply flavored enmoladas verdes. With a choice of either cochinita pibil (pork) or hongos (mushroom; here, lion's mane), most anyone

can enjoy this stuffed and saucy blue-cornand-cheese main course. We cleaned every morsel of our respective plates. and mine, the veggie version, was so satisfying - I'd return to Nômadé just to gobble that alone. Grand finale "Mango

Passion" – sphere of coconut-lime sorbet, sliver of mango, custardy passion fruit-mango, gorgeous dots of prickly pear gel, and a dragon fruit crumble – is exactly what I hope for in a dessert: fresh, sweet-tart, fruity, pretty.

Overall, this is definitely a pricey dining experience, but we left completely full and content, eager to return and see what these creative folks unveil next. If, like me, you're craving big bold flavors sans gluten, Nômadé is still more affordable than a plane ticket to the lovely Yucatán Peninsula.

Donya Stockton's "Endless" Weaves the Shape of Things to Come VISUALARTS

Solo show at Northern-Southern runs through Feb. 18 by WAYNE ALAN BRENNER

At Phillip Niemeyer's intimate Northern-Southern gallery Downtown, topology itself is quivering in delight. Yes. Donva Stockton - the multitalented woman behind legendary club venues Beerland, Rio Rita, King Bee, and more - has a new exhibition of her avant-garde weaving on display there, and topology (the properties of a geometric object that are preserved under continuous deformations) is being stretched and twisted to its real-life limits in the most compelling ways.

We've previously profiled Stockton because of her (formerly) below-the-radar career as a basketweaver (see: "Donya Stockton Isn't Going Anywhere Near Hell in That Handbasket," back in 2016), but this is the first time we're reviewing a dedicated exhibition by the artist.

That's right: Artist. Not craftsperson - which is never a slur, but only a distinction - but artist. Stockton had already moved beyond categories of crafting years ago, rendering forms that defied even ornamental utility, but this collection of her newest work lands the fanciful and labor-intensive objects more squarely (or, perhaps, dodecahedronically) in the realm of high art.

In "Endless," arrayed within the spare Northern-Southern space on a series of tables and plinths, Stockton's most recent variations on what's structurally possible in weaving reeds and cords have left the norms, and even the abnorms, of basketry far behind. "I was doing nothing but toruses for a while," she told us in 2016. "I got stuck with everything having a hole in the middle of it, but

now I'm trying to not do that." Achievement unlocked: There's not much in "Endless" that smacks of the ol' doughnut shape, the curled lengths of woven material instead branching out like small-scale architecture on a ruptured Mandelbrot bender, piece after piece fracturing filamented surface toward almost non-Euclidean expression.

At least that much, the proverbial "next level" of creative exploration, could've been extrapolated from Stockton's previous works. (Sure, it could've been - if one had an imagination and critical thinking abilities on par with those of the artist, anyway.) What surprises most in "Endless" is the incorporation of natural objects within the handwrought pieces, as Stockton has further disrupted surface etiquette by strategically entwining **Donya Stockton has** brought the mundane to the celestial. bent topology to her creative pleasure. and revealed a small universe of new possibilities in the world of weaving.

enormous seed pods and pieces of driftwood and flat lozenges of copper and more into her intricately woven fabric.

"That was inspired by living in Oaxaca," the artist tells us. "There are a bunch of trees here that have these weird seed pods, and I'd see them as I was walking around and I'd think, 'I bet I could do something cool with those!' So I started obsessively collecting them from off the ground whenever I'd find them. The really long flat ones are from the Framboyán tree. They're super heavy and woody, so I started drilling holes into them to see what I could do and discovered that I can iust weave them directly into the frameworks that I was already creating. They both follow and direct the curves I was already wanting. So it seemed like the perfect complement to what I was already doing/wanting to do."

The Oaxacan influence is also reflected (literally) in the reeds and cords that Stockton braids as foundations for these seemingly extradimensional yet deeply earthbound sculptures. Tinted with natural dyes of indigo, cochineal, and marigolds, the bending lines of support radiate what hues are available precisely where the wares are being wrought. "The range of colors that you can achieve with just those three dyes is pretty impressive," says the artist, her fingers finally faded free of work-related pigmentation.

By integrating such site-specific foragings into constructions that resemble glitchridden models of astrophysical singularities, Donya Stockton has brought the mundane to the celestial, bent topology to her creative pleasure, and revealed a small universe of new possibilities in the world of weaving - a universe that's on display within the tightly woven core of your city right now.

WAR AND PEACE GOES POP

Natasha, Pierre & the Great Comet of 1812 scales down Tolstoy's masterwork

Musicals like Natasha, Pierre & the Great Comet of 1812 are the reason people fear for the state of Broadway. It's another of those slightly arch works in which the cast explain their emotional states in a setting about which the text and audience can be mildly smug.

That's not to say that the current Zach Theatre production of Dave Mallov's 2017 Tony-award-winning electropop opera redux of War and Peace is without fun or charm. This version of Tolstoy's mighty epic avoids the battlefields and centers instead on the lascivious schemings of the Moscow social set. Greatest attention is paid to Natasha, Russian literature's most insufferable brat, and Kelly Belarmino suitably captures her childish selfishness and sense of wonder. Even though she is betrothed to Andrey (Hayden Stanes), who we are constantly reminded isn't here because he is off at war, she becomes infatuated with the roguish and handsome Anatole (an excellently caddish Jackson Mattek).

As with the novel, the only honest player is Pierre, Tolstoy's proxy in despair at the flaws of Tsarist Russia. Ryan Everett Wood

plays him older and more grizzled than in the book, his blend of dissolute carousing and maudlin philosophizing adding both narrative and emotional weight. It makes sense that this Pierre is left to clean up everyone else's messes, and Wood bursts through the musical's glibness with grace and pathos.

However, for laughs, nothing exceeds Stanes in his second role as Andrey's father, the domineering and senile Old Prince. He's actually pulling treble duty, also appearing as the troika driver Balaga for Comet's showstopping dance number bearing his name.

But somehow it all feels like two-thirds of a story. It starts with a "previously on ..." style "Prologue" in which the interwoven families of this slice of Moscow's high society are introduced. It's the first warning of constant narrative hand-holding, seemingly based on the fear that the audience isn't capable of keeping up (although, considering how many audience members last Saturday were poring over the illustrated family tree in the program midshow, maybe that presumption isn't wrong). Some of that audience is seated onstage at bar tables, a style that has become de rigueur

for productions of cabaret that affords some degree of audience interaction. Unfortunately, here it occasionally turns into knowing asides, further reminding the audience that it's not real. Indeed, Malloy makes his disdain for anything serious obvious with "The Opera." In Tolstoy's book, the scene provides insight into young Natasha's shallow, provincial nature, but Mallov's book makes it a farce. Zach production director Dave Steakley executes the scene as an expressionistic dumbshow, and that's hilarious, but little more.

Ultimately, Steakley is fighting to shove Malloy's Gilbert & Sullivan sensibilities into Tolstoy's grander, darker work. If only Malloy had embraced Pierre's earnestness over Anatole's dismissive self-indulgence, The Great Comet might blaze brighter.


