





ONE WATER TO RULE THEM ALL

Dear Editor,

In a previous letter to the editor ["Save Roy Creek," Feedback, Feb. 23], the Mirasol Springs project, along the Pedernales River near where it is crossed by Hamilton Pool Road, is asserted to be in "West Austin," and it is claimed the draw on local groundwater would threaten "the well-being of fellow Austinites and the place we call home." Indeed water usage there can be called to question, but to pose it as an "Austin" problem strains credulity. It's a Hill Country problem. The situation is reviewed on the Waterblogue at [waterblogue.com], setting forth a "One Water" scheme, a water infrastructure model that would drastically reduce draw on the area's water supplies. The 27-million-gallon annual usage that previous letter asserted is 83 acre-feet per year,

but as the Waterblogue reviews, demand on local sources could be way below that, by basing a goodly portion of water supply on building-scale rainwater harvesting, with reclaimed "waste" water fulfilling a large portion of, maybe even all, irrigation demands. Using the "One Water" scheme - husbanding all the water that flows through our communities - for water supply, "waste" water management, and storm water management would be more fiscally reasonable for the developer while saving a whole lot of water for society and significantly blunting water quality degradation. This could be a real "One Water" showcase, an opportunity to actually set, as the developer claims in the banner of its "vision" page, a "new standard for environmentally focused Hill Country development." Rather than just greenwashing a very conventional set of practices, which is where this project is currently heading. We can, and should, do better to preserve and protect the Hill Country water environment. Please consider how you can advocate for them to go with the "One Water" scheme instead. Thank you. 

We Need a Cease-Fire Now

On Feb. 4, Bert James Baker was arrested for stabbing Zacharia Doar, a 23-year-old Palestinian man, after a pro-cease-fire rally in Austin. As a community, we need to reject the notion that anti-Palestinian violence is "on the other side of the globe," per Mayor Kirk Watson's public statement, because this hate crime has made it plain that it is here in Austin, too.

We are Jewish students and proud Austinites compelled to speak out about the local political climate that enabled this horrendous hate crime. Austin officials, through their silence in the face of a U.S.funded genocide against Palestinians, have normalized their murder and emboldened racists in our own community. Our officials must take steps to ensure the safety of our Palestinian and Arab community members, which includes condemning anti-Palestinian violence from Austin to Gaza.

Mayor Watson's statement reaffirms his opposition to a cease-fire resolution while touching only cursorily on the horrifying stabbing of Zacharia **BY SOPHIA** Doar. The statement fails to con-SCHLESINGER nect this attack with the rise in & JOSHUA Islamophobia and anti-Palestinian violence locally and nationally. We are disturbed to see local officials - including Mayor Watson, as well as

UT-Austin President Jay Hartzell, and others - parrot rhetoric that conflates anti-Zionism with antisemitism, and suggests Palestinian safety comes at the cost of Jewish safety. We are disturbed to see these same officials express concern about our community following October 7 without extending that concern to Palestinians.

As Jews, we reject wholeheartedly these attempts to speak on our behalf. The common root of anti-Palestinian and antisemitic violence is white supremacy. It is for this reason that we stand in solidarity with the family of Zacharia Doar in demanding that Texas leaders support an immediate and permanent cease-fire.

While our local leaders remain shamefully silent, the University of Texas at Austin continues to host public events with speakers who openly embrace genocidal rhetoric. At a recent talk on campus, Yaron Brook justified mass civilian casualties by arguing that Israel should consider the entire Palestinian population an enemy. As Jewish students at UT-Austin, we are alarmed and ashamed that our campus uplifts rhetoric that fuels extremism in the broader Austin community.

Over the last four months, the Israeli military has killed more than 28,000 people in Gaza, with many more missing or trapped under the rubble. Every day, we watch as Israel flagrantly violates the Jan. 26 International Court of Justice ruling by blocking aid trucks, targeting medical workers, and most recently bombing Rafah, despite there being nowhere else for civilians there to go. This genocide is fully funded by the United States government, which sends \$3.8 billion in military funding to the Israeli government each year.

The targeting of people in our community makes Israel's slaughter a local issue. We are tired of being told by City Council members like Chito Vela that a cease-fire resolution is not a local issue when extremists are attacking Palestinians in our streets. We would

further like to remind these Austin pol-

iticians that there is local precedent for international resolutions. like in 2003 when the Austin City Council went on record in opposition of preemptive military action in Iraq. We have spent the last four

months witnessing a genocide unfold, watching death and destruction

on our smartphones. The attack on Gaza is unprecedented by international standards in terms of the level of destruction and number of deaths in such a short amount of time. Yet the mayor fears that a cease-fire resolution might incite "division, shouting, and recriminations."

To Mayor Watson we ask: What is "shouting," measured against the slaughter in Gaza? What weight do "recriminations" carry when white supremacists are brutally targeting Palestinians in the streets of our own university campuses? We reject silence and so-called unity built on the suffering of our Palestinian siblings. We need a cease-fire now.





ABBOTT GETTING WHAT HE WANTS:

Gov. **Greg Abbott** vowed political revenge against fellow Republicans in the Texas House after two dozen of them joined Democrats in last year's legislative session to tank his school voucher proposal. To that end, Abbott contributed millions to pro-school choice candidates and incumbents in 30 House races for the March primary, the *Statesman* reported. Yesterday's election shows that the money worked. Almost half of the incumbent R's lost



outright. The prospects for the approval of vouchers just got a lot brighter.

AND KEN PAXTON TOO: Another Republican in the crosshairs of the far right this election season is

Speaker of the House **Dade Phelan**. A.G. Ken Paxton led the charge for Phelan to be primaried, after the speaker approved Paxton's impeachment by the House last May. Now, Phelan is in a run-off with challenger **David Covey**. In addition to Phelan, Paxton has campaigned against 35 House Republicans. *The Dallas Morning News* reported 20 of the 35 beat their challengers.

AND EVEN MORE REPUBLICAN

INFIGHTING: Paxton's revenge tour did not stop with House Republicans. He was enraged with eight of the judges on the **Texas Court of Criminal Appeals** for ruling against him in 2021. Paxton targeted three of the judges up for reelection in this year's primary and all have been voted out.

The Total Solar Eclipse Is Coming


The once-in-a-lifetime darkness will bring hordes of tourists to Central Texas BY ROBYN ROSS

At 1:36pm on Monday, April 8, the sun will disappear, and the sky over Austin will go dark.

Perhaps you saw the partial eclipse in August 2017 or caught the annular "ring of fire" eclipse last October. A total solar eclipse – when the moon passes between the sun and the Earth, completely blocking the sun – is an entirely different experience. A strip of land in the moon's shadow, called the path of totality, is plunged into twilight in the middle of the day. Those who have witnessed a total eclipse say it's a mystical, awe-inspiring, even life-changing event. Local officials have just over a month to finish preparing for the eclipse and for the thousands of visitors who will travel to see it.

No one knows exactly how many people are coming to Austin. Most estimates of eclipse visitation come from GreatAmericanEclipse.com, the project of eclipse chaser and geographer Michael Zeiler. His model is based primarily on population data and the placement of major highways. It assumes Texas will have better weather, and thus more visitors, than spots farther north. Zeiler's model, which he said proved accurate for the 2017 eclipse, projects that up to 1.08 million people will travel by car to a Texas destination for the eclipse. Zeiler has forecasted visitation for a few towns in the path – Kerrville should prepare for a whopping potential 488,000 guests – but he says Austin's number is harder to predict.

Because it's at the edge of the path of totality, it's not as desirable a destination as towns farther west. But out-of-state visitors heading to those towns will fly into Austin

LOW PRIMARY TURNOUT. AS ALWAYS: Voter turnout in the March primary was significantly lower in early voting than in the 2020 election, despite the state gaining more registered voters in the last four years, The Texas Tribune reported this week.

ZURAWSKI HONORED: Thursday, USA Today announced that Austin's Amanda Zurawski is the Texas honoree for USA Today's Women of the Year. Zurawski is the lead plaintiff in the Center for Reproductive Rights lawsuit challenging Texas' abortion laws, having nearly died due to a spreading infection after she was denied an abortion in 2022.

NONPROFIT CUTS OFF HEDGE FUND

PAPERS: Speaking of USA Today, it's owned by Gannett, a corporation known for hollowing out local newspapers (including the Statesman). Report for America, which sends hundreds of journalists into local newsrooms, announced this week it will no longer partner with hedge fund- or private equity-owned businesses including Gannett, writing that business models like Gannett's "[aren't] the future for robust local news."


TRIBUNE PARTNERS WITH FRONTLINE:

In good news for local journalism, The Texas Tribune announced its partnership with *Frontline*, the investigative documentary series by PBS. The partnership will aid reporters in analyzing immigration and politics along the border in a critical election year, the Tribune announced.

TRUMP < 3 ABBOTT: In a perfect example of the border's role in the presidential election, Donald Trump said Abbott is on his short list of vice presidential candidates during his visit to the border last week (at the same time that Joe Biden was there). Sean Hannity asked during his show if Abbott was under consideration. "He's done a great job." Trump replied. "Yeah. certainly he would be somebody I would very much consider."

or San Antonio, and that weekend is already a busy one here: the Capitol 10,000 race is Sunday morning, and the CMT Music Awards are Sunday night. Plus, April is a popular time to visit Central Texas.

"I would not say that we are actively promoting our city as a place to come see the eclipse, because we know that they're already coming," says Wesley Lucas, Visit Austin's director of communications. Visit Austin's survey of hotels indicates that, for eclipse weekend, Downtown hotels are at 73% occupancy and hotels citywide are at 50% occupancy - twice the advance bookings typically seen this time of year. (For context, Formula 1 weekend finishes with hotels at 85% to 95% occupancy.)

Anticipating overwhelming visitation, many Hill Country towns have been holding town hall meetings to help residents prepare, and some have appointed an eclipse coordinator to lead preparations. School districts have canceled classes to reduce traffic. Some towns are hosting a large public viewing in a centrally located park.

Austin, a larger city more accustomed to hosting major events, is handling things differently.

Astronomy educator Lucia Brimer and Hill Country Alliance Night Sky Program Manager Dawn Davies were two of the first Austinites to push for eclipse readiness. By September 2022, they were convening monthly meetings with an education-oriented task force that included representatives from the Thinkery, UT-Austin, the Austin Astronomical Society,

and Austin Community College. The group's primary aim was to coordinate their dispersed eclipse-day activities.

Traffic management and emergency preparation were not in the group's wheelhouse.

So, on Nov. 2, Brimer, Davies and a task force colleague testified before City Council in support of a resolution sponsored by Council Member Alison Alter directing

promoting our city as

city staff to create a plan for the eclipse by Feb. 1. The resolution, which Council approved, asked staff to launch a campaign to make the public aware of the eclipse: disseminate safety information through multiple alert systems and in multiple languages; host viewings at libraries and parks; and anticipate

increased demand for emergency services.

The Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management released the city's response on Feb. 27. The memo says the department plans to share information through a press conference in early April - shortly before eclipse day - and points residents to readycentraltexas.org/eclipse, where eclipse and eye safety information can be translated into multiple languages. Police, fire and EMS are prepared to increase staffing around April 8, and Homeland Security has been coordinating with the 10-county Capital

Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) and TxDOT on safety and traffic issues.

At a Feb. 21 meeting of CAPCOG emergency managers, attendees discussed plans to provide fuel for emergency vehicles even if gas stations run out. They reviewed the communications channels first responders will use in the likely event that cell networks in the western counties are overwhelmed. They talked about how to handle visitors' emergencies when the region's hospitals are already stretched to capacity.

Still, said CAPCOG Director of Homeland Security Martin Ritchey, "No matter how much planning a local government, county government, the region and the state do, it's really going to come down to the individual's preparedness."

HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP:

1) Decide where you'll be on Monday, April 8. The link at the QR code (t.ly/5X78l) shows the path of totality. Everywhere within the path will experience the total solar eclipse; totality will last longer closer to the blue centerline. In Austin, the partial eclipse begins at 12:17pm and totality lasts about two minutes starting at 1:36pm. The city recommends Austinites watch close to their homes, workplaces, or schools to cut down on traffic.

2) If you plan to travel, bring extra food, water, diapers, toilet paper, and cash (ATMs may run out, and card transactions might not work if cell networks go down), along with a paper map (communication networks may be overwhelmed).

3) Obtain your safety glasses now. Be sure

they meet the ISO 12312-2 safety standard. In 2017, unsafe counterfeit glasses - some with the ISO symbol - proliferated on Amazon, so the American Astronomical Society this year compiled a list of trusted manufacturers, available at t.ly/O06M5. Parks and **Recreation Department** facilities will distribute

10,000 pairs of glasses beginning March 11, and library branches will have a limited supply available shortly before April 8.

4) Share information about the eclipse with people in your community, especially those who don't speak English.

5) Find out what your child's school plans to do on April 8. AISD is holding classes and will provide eclipse glasses for students and staff. If you're staying in town for the eclipse, buy groceries and gas before April 5. Follow readycentraltexas.org/eclipse for safety and event updates.



YouTube Music workers rally in 2023

YouTube Music Workers Laid Off in Possible Retaliation for Organizing

City Council lends support BY LINA FISHER

At last week's City Council meeting, a group of local unionized **Google** contractors were preparing to speak on a resolution from Council Member **Zo Qadri** that would send a formal message from Council in support of their negotiation efforts. As they took the podium, **Katie-Marie Marschner** got a text from a colleague at the office: The entire team had been laid off, effective immediately. She informed her colleague on the podium (captured in a clip that has since gone viral), and when she got back to the office to pick up her things, she says she was met with hostility from HR, who told her she was trespassing before calling police.

Since a group of 40 **YouTube Music** workers voted to join the **Alphabet Workers Union** early last year, the union has filed nine unfair labor practice charges with the **National Labor Relations Board** (NLRB) for Google's refusal to bargain and other apparent retaliations. Google's contention is that they aren't really the employer, because YouTube Music workers are technically hired by Cognizant, a subsidiary of Google. The NLRB has ruled that Cognizant and Google are indeed joint employers, but the tech giant refuses to accept that and is appealing the decision in federal court.

The workers' cause has been supported nationally by Sen. Bernie Sanders and Rep. Greg Casar, but it seems Google's powerful influence still sways Council. Right before workers were set to speak on Qadri's resolution, they were informed it had been pulled and postponed at Google's request. After the public firing, Qadri placed the resolution back on the agenda. It passed 9-1, with Mackenzie Kelly abstaining. Turns out, Kelly had worked to delay the vote at the request of Katharine McAden, head of public policy and external affairs for Google's Southern U.S. region. An email obtained by the Chronicle shows McAden contacted Council Tuesday reminding them how Google has "invested heavily in the Austin-area, supporting local initiatives, and working to effectively grow workforce opportunities."

During the meeting, Kelly explained her refusal to support the resolution, saying "the city should refrain from intervening in the affairs of private companies."

The rest of Council disagreed: Qadri wrote in a statement post-vote that "Austin is a union city, and as the sponsor of this resolution, I will always stand with labor. What happened today was unconscionable ... those workers were paid below living wage in Austin, despite working for a multi-billion dollar **Fortune 100 company**. And now, without warning, they've lost their jobs."

Over the weekend, workers met with their organizer to discuss next steps. "We're looking at the full range of legal options within the NLRB and elsewhere. We believe [this layoff] to be an illegal act of retaliation." said another laid-off employee. Sam Regan. In the meantime, the workers have been placed on "the bench," a tech industry concept similar to severance. The team will continue to receive their existing pay and benefits for seven weeks and are encouraged to apply for other positions within Cognizant. Regan and Marschner say they've heard anecdotally that no one gets hired from the bench, and they aren't keen to continue working for this company anyway. For the last year, their team had been training another one in India, "mirroring ours in terms of size and division of labor. We watched it happen and knew something was awfully fishy about it. And once that team was built up enough, they fired us."

Nationally, a new NLRB rule that took effect in December makes it easier for contract workers to unionize – a powerful tool against tech giants that rely on third-party employers. Under the rule, a company is considered an employer if they control working conditions like pay and scheduling. However, even under the much more conservative previous Trumpera rule, the NLRB still sided with the workers. As Google's appeal is heard by the federal court, Regan says "it'll be really interesting to see how this [new rule] plays out. I know a lot of people are watching."

TEXAS CAN'T TRUMPFEDERAL

IMMIGRATION LAW: Is Abbott doing "a great job" though? A federal judge in Austin, U.S. District Judge David Ezra, issued a preliminary injunction last week that will keep Texas' extreme immigration law Senate Bill 4 from being enforced while the court challenge against it plays out. Ezra explained that the state's disagreement with federal immigration policy doesn't justify violating the Supremacy Clause.

BUT ABBOTT PROJECTS CONFIDENCE:

Abbott tweeted about Ezra's decision Thursday, saying he's "not worried," because the Supreme Court will decide in the end. "Texas has solid legal grounds to defend against an invasion," he wrote. Those grounds are based on the Constitution's allowance for states to defend themselves against acts of war. Three individual appeals courts already ruled in the 1990s that immigration doesn't qualify as an invasion, Bloomberg Law reported.

DROUGHT RELIEF, FOR NOW: Luckily, there's some good news at home. The Barton Springs/Edwards Aquifer Conservation District is now in the least severe drought stage. The district entered the most severe drought state for the first time in its 36-year history in December. Rain in January and February brought the severity down in March, the Austin Monitor reported.

CITY MANAGER SEARCH NARROWS:

We're also getting closer to stability at City Hall. Tuesday, Mayor **Kirk Watson** announced the three finalists in City Council's quest to find Austin's next city manager. After reviewing 39 applications, Dallas City Manager T.C. Broadnax, Denton City Manager Sara Hensley, and Kansas City, Mo., City Manager Brian Platt made the list. Council members will interview the finalists March 26 and could vote on a contract with their preferred candidate as soon as April 2.

Despite Being Vastly Outspent by Challenger, José Garza's Progressive Message Still Has Austin's Support

After winning primary in a landslide, Garza is certain to win reelection BY AUSTIN SANDERS

Travis County's incumbent District Attorney José Garza prevailed over his well-funded challenger Jeremy Sylestine in a decisive victory in the March 5 Democratic race.

Garza ended the night with a 33% lead over Sylestine, according to unofficial results posted by the Travis County Clerk's Office. The result represents a commanding victory for the progressive D.A., who has been the target of right-wing attacks since emerging as a serious threat to prior D.A. **Margaret Moore** in 2020. Sylestine, who mounted a challenge to Garza late in the candidate filing period for the primary, was supported by moderate Democrats like Moore, Republican donors and voters, the **Austin Police Association** (APA President Michael Bullock has been present for campaign events), and late in the game, even **Elon Musk**.

In the 2020 election, which was held during the pinnacle of the 2020 summer of protest in support of the **Black Lives Matter** movement, Garza defeated Moore – an establishment figure well-liked by law enforcement – by more than 30 points. Since then, Garza has not faced a public test of how Travis County residents view his progressive, and somewhat controversial, approach to the top law enforcement job in the county. His term has been defined by efforts to divert more people from jail, pursuing shorter prison sentences in some cases, and prosecuting law enforcement officials accused of using excessive force on-duty. But Garza has now replicated 2020's resounding victory – in a less favorable election environment, no less – which he said signals broad support for those policies that have drawn the ire of high-powered Republicans, including lawmakers who passed legislation last year to force D.A.s to prosecute abortion and anti-LGBT cases. "Our movement is stronger even now than when we started," Garza told supporters from the stage at Hotel Vegas, about two hours after polls closed and it was clear he had fended off Sylestine. "Let me say this: Our movement to fix our broken criminal justice system is here to stay."

In his remarks to supporters, Garza referenced another prominent aspect of the race – the coalescing of Republican support around Sylestine and the infusion of extreme, rightwing messaging in support of Sylestine's campaign. "Anonymous dark-money organizations spent untold dollars promoting lies and peddling misinformation to try to scare voters into turning their backs on progress," Garza told supporters. "In the face of those negative attacks, it would have been understandable for us to lose heart and give in to that fear and intimidation but ... this community didn't take the bait."

The "dark-money organization" Garza referenced was **Saving Austin**, an unregistered political action committee based out of the Dallas suburb of Irving. A week before election day, Saving Austin mailed Travis County voters a campaign ad in support of Sylestine that featured an adult hand covering the mouth of a child and a message saying Garza's policies have "filled Austin's streets with pedophiles and killers." The shocking ad roiled Austin's mostly liberal Democratic voting base and prompted Sylestine to issue a statement disavowing the message and declaring his campaign had no part in crafting or transmitting it.

Even without accounting for outside expenditures, Sylestine vastly outspent Garza; a Feb. 26 campaign finance report from Sylestine shows more than \$1.2 million in expenditures by his campaign. The massive financial support came mostly from wealthy Austinites and high-dollar GOP donors. A report from Garza covering the same time period shows about \$137,000 in expenditures.

Shortly after early vote results were posted and it was clear Garza had amassed an insurmountable lead over Sylestine, the challenger told the *Chronicle* he was proud of the "moderate message" he campaigned on around public safety, but regretted that "extreme" messaging drowned it out. "We had a moderate message that got hijacked by people that had different intentions," Sylestine told us. "I was never one to come in and try to divide the party, but there's a lot of space that's been ignored in that moderate area." It is possible the extreme messages turned off some voters. Garza not only did well in East Austin, where his base of support lives, but even in most of Central and large parts of West Austin, where Sylestine's financial support centered.

Sylestine's campaign featured support from Travis County crime victims who were displeased with their interactions with Garza's office. Sylestine said he hopes the incumbent, who will serve another four years as D.A., will listen to those concerns. "I hope he can do that in a way that honors his campaign and creates a conversation in the future."

As for Garza, he told us that he's looking at continuing to make progress on reforming the local justice system. "Travis County is one of the safest communities in the country and we're going to continue full speed ahead," Garza said. "We are working to address the root causes of crimes in our community because we know that that approach works, and we know that people support it overwhelmingly. So that's what we're gonna continue to do."

Garza will face off against Daniel Betts, who ran unopposed in the Republican primary, in the Nov. 5 general election. Because more than two-thirds of Travis County voters typically vote Democratic, Garza is almost certain to win.

LET'S TALK IT OUT: Austin police haven't had a contract with the city in a long time. Nearly one year after the 2018 meet and confer agreement between the city and Austin Police Association expired and negotiations over a new labor contract ended, Watson announced that talks between the city and APA would resume next week. SETON NURSES FINALLY WIN CONTRACT WITH ASCENSION: There

Sherine Thomas Unseats Incumbent in Family-Focused 353rd Court, Takes On Backlog

She aims to have streamlined court processes in the first six months BY MAGGIE Q. THOMPSON

Sherine Thomas is a believer in the American dream, but she didn't expect to become a judge. When her mother emigrated from India, she came alone, recruited in the early 1970s as the United States struggled with a nursing shortage. She wrote home to her husband and two daughters every night, sometimes crying, sometimes too tired to start over when tears smudged the ink. "A lot of people sacrificed for this," Thomas told the *Chronicle* Wednesday.

She said becoming a lawyer, let alone a judge, "wasn't necessarily the specific plan. But it was the hope that my family had for us, to be able to do great, wonderful things. Little Sherine would not have thought this would be a thing. But I had the wonderful voices of my parents and my family and my sister saying, 'Yes, you can.'"

Thomas thinks it was both her decades of experience in Travis County's legal community and her perspective on the justice system's role that convinced 47,000 Democratic voters (56%) she was the right choice. "The courthouse was a symbol of the promise and potential of this country, and I wanted to make sure that we were living up to that promise and potential for everybody. I think that's what resonated."

In her bid for the 353rd Court, which handles family issues including child custody, Thomas was up against incumbent **Madeleine Connor** and challenger **Susana Castillo**, a relatively new face in Travis County's political scene. Castillo's campaign focused on equal access to the justice system, especially for immigrants.

Connor said she's grateful to the 12,000 people who voted for her. "I believe that's a comment on my good work as a judge," she said. Connor has been a controversial judge, as she was twice deemed a vexatious litigant and, in an unusual move, ran for a different district judge seat (419th) while still in office, which would have left the 353rd open to a Gov. **Greg Abbott** appointee. Connor said she's looking forward to serving out the remainder of her term, "with the same judicial curiosity and civility as I've demonstrated throughout my tenure. My goal was, and always has been, providing a level playing field to the citizens of this county." She emphasized that her colleagues are all "kind, smart, and selfless. They all deserve their seats. I'm sure Sherine will fit right in."

Thomas said she hopes to shadow Judge Connor and other civil court judges before she takes office. Her focus, at first, will be on efficiency and clearing up backlogged cases. She hopes to have the backlog cleared in six months. When her own court is in order. she plans to work with other district judges to expand existing programs that connect people in every court to free legal resources. "I do think we have some great inroads into those conversations, and I can't do any of that alone," Thomas said. "But I don't think the judges that are on the bench right now are going to be hurdles. Rather, they're gonna be really great teammates figuring out where the pitfalls are so we can overcome them."

TANISA JEFFERS WINS BIG IN JP5 CONTEST

She will lead county's main evictions court BY BRANT BINGAMON

It was after 10:30pm when the *Chronicle* finally caught up with **Tanisa Jeffers**. She had awoken an hour earlier, learned she had won the contest for Justice of the Peace Precinct 5, and headed down to the post-election party at Hotel Vegas.

"I apologize, I'm still rubbing the sleep out of my eyes," Jeffers said. "I work at night. I'm

a night court judge, and I sleep during the daytime. I've got to be at work in 20 minutes, but I'm here."

At that point it had been three hours since early voting results showed Jeffers with a wide lead over her opponents, **Rick Olivo**, the current judge of JP5, and Travis County prosecutor **Ornela DeSeta**. Jeffers wound up taking 61% of the vote to Olivo's 20% and DeSeta's 19%. The margin of victory surprised some people, and

Jeffers was one of them. "We were preparing for the run-off," she said. "We were trying to be judicious with our resources, because we knew that was a big, big possibility."

JP5 is one of Travis County's busiest courts – Olivo has called it "the people's court." It handles misdemeanors, including bond and eviction cases. Olivo has led the court since September of 2023, when the Travis County Commissioners Court chose him over Jeffers to succeed Nick Chu, who had stepped down after six years of progressive leadership on the bench. Olivo had the most judicial experience of the candidates the commissioners had to choose from.

The race for JP5 was Jeffers' third in the last four years, after she lost to **Dimple Malhotra** for County Court at Law No. 4 in 2020 and **Mary Ann Espiritu** for CC5 in 2022. She's

> been an attorney in Austin for two decades and already served as a magistrate judge for the county's JP courts. As a Black woman, she told us she believes it's important for Travis County to have Black judges on the bench, especially in JP5, where a disproportionate number of people facing eviction are people of color. She is excited that she'll now be able to explore more options for helping tenants facing eviction, including the

use of an Eviction Diversion Court.

Jeffers also said she hopes limiting evictions can help with Austin's housing affordability problem. "There's a housing crisis in Austin," she said. "I mean, I cannot afford to live here anymore and I'm a judge, right? We need to go forward and push this envelope. And it's going to start with our local JP to properly handle all the evictions that we've had as a result of coming out of the pandemic."

The Four Horsemen of the SXSW Music-pocalypse

TRYING ON FOUR LOCAL PERSONIFICATIONS OF FEST SUCCESS

Did you hear that? As globe-trotting suits confirm their hotel reservations, Austin's most music-loving, hard-partying locals let out a collective, temple-rubbing sigh.

For all the stress South by Southwest guarantees, the world's biggest musical convergence offers a plethora of free, and badge only, musical riches. It's a lot to pore over (see this week's special insert), so with what feels like a trillion showcases and day parties confirmed over the next eight days, we turn to four personifications of SXSW success. From college go-getters to old head Austin natives, this quartet of townie archetypes respectively seeks musical newcomers, tried-and-true classics, city escapism, or big-name stars.

Meet the Four Horsemen of the SXSW Music-pocalypse, and surf their schedules below.

THE CUTTING-EDGE TRENDCASTER

"You probably haven't heard of it" incarnate, this lineup close-reader turns to savvy showcase presenters in search of the next big thing.

Pulling acts from a college radio DJ's playlist, Australian publication Monster Children takes over Empire Garage on Wednesday. March 13. with a stacked bill of buzzy indie rock acts, including synth rock trio Automatic, enigmatic British post-punks bar italia, and Chicago act Deeper. The next day, Lustre Pearl's Rainey Street Revival gets weirder, tapping industrial rap duo Ho99o9, Mexican punks Los Cogelones, and genre-bending pop pair Kiss Bang. Thursday evening, this septum-pierced Dr. Martens-wearer will hit the Creek and the Cave's Snake Charmer display, featuring the likes of shoegaze revivalists Horse Jumper of Love, Austin-launched psych band Mamalarky, Dallas-based slowcore band Teethe, and indie sleaze survivor STRFKR, offering a DJ set.

Space Agency and the Nothing Song log a final-Friday contender at hipster headquarters, Hotel Vegas and Volstead, March 15. Beginning at 7pm with Arielle Soucy's folk stylings and Le Couleur's take on disco, the bill gets heavier over time. This industry fortune teller's most excited for Hong Kong shoegazers Arches and Seattle artist MØAA, whose darkwave discography could certainly transfix a future Levitation audience. Also on the Eastside, Marshall sets up at Parish, March 13-15, for a free-with-RSVP indie rock carnival featuring heavy lifters Frank Turner, the Black Angels, and Therapy?

THE "IF IT AIN'T BROKE" NOSTALGIST

This guintessential Old Austin defender remembers when a one-bedroom apartment rented for \$300/month - coincidentally, likely the same time SXSW began throwing free-to-thepublic concerts at Lady Bird Lake. Though they'll grumble about the city's heightening skyline while heading to Auditorium Shores, they'll likely quiet down when scene veterans Joe "King" Carrasco, Patrice Pike, Ian Moore, Vallejo, and Bob Schneider hit the stage in a March 14 tribute to Steamboat 1874 Austin, the Sixth Street venue that shuttered at the turn of the century. As long as Peepaw doesn't break a hip the next day, busting a move during Parliament-Funkadelic bassist Bootsy Collins' set with fellow funk icons Zapp, he might bring his grandkids to the park on March 16, when Sabrina Ellis and Andrew Cashen from A Giant Dog lead KUTX's kidfriendly Rock the Shores show.

Across the highway, nonprofit EQ Austin joins SX's free community festivities at the Grackle, where two nights of local programming include EXOTIC FRUITICA, Stephanie Bergara, Kalu James, and Como Las Movies. This penny-pinching nostalgist also pencils in South by San José, the "always and forever free" concert series returning for its 25th year between the South Congress Jo's Coffee and Hotel San José. Day lineups aren't out yet, but the March 13 to 17 day dates feature Austin punk Alejandro Escovedo, local disco/funk/Afrobeat collective Golden Dawn Arkestra, and Stephenville country rock band Giovannie & the Hired Guns.

Otherwise, the Austin old-timer might be confused by a new official venue, the Backyard at the Downright Hotel. Home to high-profile presenters the British Music Embassy, the 701 E. Eleventh address routes to the old Sheraton, in the midst of a rebrand.



THE SOUTH AUSTIN HOMEBODY

For every hundred bar crawlers, there's one South Austin suburbanite who wants to drive to a beer garden, hang out all day, and avoid the downtown chaos. On March 10, they'll set up shop at the Far Out Lounge. where Midnight in the Garden presents Sound Wine Fest, a combination of wine tasting, vintage markets, food vendors, and live music that extends from 3pm to midnight. Milling around the outdoor space to the sounds of locals the Bright Light Social Hour and Star Parks, plus Colombian psychedelic funk group Balthys and singer-songwriter Vlad Holiday, this festival black sheep will revel in a relatively quiet Sunday Funday.

Paid-parking avoiders also score huge this year with Radio/East, the Radio Coffee & Beer offshoot that brought in music photographer Pooneh Ghana to book her own concert series. This SXSW, Ghana schedules two free-with-RSVP parties on March 14 and 15. Day one features local acts A Giant Dog and Big Bill, plus Nashville punks Snööper, Levitation favorites Shannon & the Clams, and Atlanta Sub Pop signees Omni. The next day packs UK post-punks Dry Cleaning, Spanish indie rock band Hinds, buzzy Brooklyn act Bodega, glam duo Faux Real, and local jam band Font.

THE HOT 100 ROCKSTAR HUNTER

This SXSW attendee wastes no time on the festival's fine print; they lock in around February, when the conference reveals which A-list celebrities are headed to town. In recent years, legacy media publications have done much of this heavy lifting. Rolling Stone returns with its second open-to-the-public Future of Music showcase, March 12 to 15 at ACL Live. The magazine pulls hip-hop acts Teezo Touchdown, Flo Milli, and Flyana Boss; überpopular Mexican singer Peso Pluma; hardcore punks Scowl; and Gen Z-beloved singer-songwriter Faye Webster. Though its separately ticketed events aren't technically SXSW affiliated, SPIN touches down in Austin with hometown hero Garv Clark Jr. at Emo's on March 13 and emo godfathers Sunny Day Real Estate at Stubb's on March 16.

Keynotes also provide prime celeb selfie opportunities. On the musician front this year, there's Selena Gomez, Danny Brown, Chuck D, John Oates, and more. In further search of name recognition, this pop lover might attend *Paste* magazine's free East Austin Block Party for X Ambassadors, whose single "Renegades" appeared in myriad 2015 commercials. Upon arrival at the Coral Snake, however, they might get turned on to some *almost* famous acts like country singer Britti, whose debut album *Hello, I'm Britti* arrives via Dan Auerbach's Easy Eye Sound, and Pylon Reenactment Society, a reworking of Eighties New Wavers Pylon.







NOTHING IS OFF-LIMITS FOR GIANMARCO SORESI

"When a joke works, it sets off a fire for me to want to be funny," says comedian Gianmarco Soresi, known for his highenergy live shows. "I think that's what's cool about the whole art form. It's like if they're trying to shock start your heart back to pumping again."

Soresi's tumultuous childhood and divorced parents are the main jumping-off points for his stand-up shows. Born in Potomac, Maryland, the entertainer originally pursued musical theatre but later found his calling making people

laugh. "I ended up writing a play for myself where I talked to the audience and found that's where all of the positive feedback was," Soresi says. "So, I pivoted to stand-up and haven't looked back."

With over 40 dates on his ongoing "Leaning In" tour, Soresi is making up for lost time. The comedian first began touring on the cusp of the COVID-19 pandemic, which was inevitably halted, and picked back up mid-2021. Since then, he's been flying back and forth from his home in New York to the next touring city every week, covering as much ground as one can manage. "That's my whole life," says Soresi.

Between spontaneous crowd work and in-depth, often sardonic storytelling, Soresi loves to push the envelope when it comes to who and what he can joke about. Otherwise risqué jokes revolving around controversial figures like Michael Jackson and R. Kelly garner unwavering waves of laughter from his audiences. "I think the edge is what gets people excited," he admits. "It's like finding those narrow pockets that I think are fun. I think it gives you the same feeling as watching a tightrope walker."

Soresi's dark sense of humor always seems to be a crowdpleaser. Fiery quips when working a room come as second nature to the comic, in addition to intriguing tales about topics like uncomfortable auditions and liberal churches. Soresi's stand-up has been featured on Comedy Central, PBS, Amazon, and Netflix,

with his 2020 special *Shelf Life* earning three New York Emmy nominations.

In addition to his sarcastic jests, the comic also spearheads comedy podcast *The Downside With Gianmarco Soresi*, where he and his co-host Russell Daniels home

in on the negative side of life. "I wanted to have a show where guests could come on and instead of talking about why they're grateful for this, that, or the other thing, they get to share the things that annoy them," he says. "That's ultimately what you do with friends. You don't feel the need to maintain appearances, and that's what the podcast is."

Just having passed the halfway mark of his current tour, Soresi doesn't plan on stopping anytime soon. Often doing multiple shows a night, the comic is cautious of avoiding burnout while still eager to make the most of his shows. "If I do feel burnt out, the moment I get that first laugh, I'm back in it," says Soresi. "Whenever I start a show, I immediately feel okay."

DAY TRIPS



Pecan Grove Store, in the rolling hills outside of **Fredericksburg**, defies the touristy trappings of its urban neighbor.

Almost a decade old, the former **Sinclair gas station** has been turned into a family-friendly, old-fashioned roadhouse with good food and great ambience. Situated north of town on scenic TX-16 and a few miles from the wildflower explosion known as the **Willow City Loop**, the Store is a destination all by itself.

Lawrence Segner opened the combination service station, store, and garage around 1957. For many years it was the local hangout for cold beer. The buildings sat vacant for nearly 20 years after he died in 1993.

As a young man, **Rick Martin** had downed a few cold ones at the gas station and loved Lawrence's homemade German sausage. When the property came up for sale, Rick's was the second offer the family received. The heirs accepted his offer because he promised not to raze the buildings, nor turn the place into another winery.

At first, Rick said, he planned to use the buildings to store his collection of antique motorcycles and cars.

His son, **Matt**, came up with a different idea. In 2014, Matt opened the old store as a bar with live music.

Using his grandmother's hamburger recipe perfected by his father, Matt added the "Dino Burger" named after the green dinosaur on the Sinclair sign out front. Big and juicy, the American classic was voted "best burger in Fredericksburg" the last four years running.

Pecan Grove Store is 5.5 miles north of Fredericksburg on TX-16, one of the prettiest roads in Texas, especially during wildflower season. The bar and burger joint has a large biergarten out back along Marschall Creek where musicians take the stage in the spring and fall. The kitchen is open Wednesday evenings, and Thursday through Saturday 11:30am to 8:30pm. They also have a campground and bunkhouse next door available through Airbnb.







Scoring Goals the Focus as Austin FC Returns Home

Austin FC's 2024 season has gotten off to a rather inauspicious start. After a disappointing 2-1 loss to Minnesota spoiled a rowdy Q2 Stadium atmosphere in the season opener, last Saturday the Verde and Black escaped its first road test of the season with a 0-0 draw against the Seattle Sounders that only a defender – or certain psychopath managers like José Mourinho and Diego Simeone – could love.

Josh Wolff isn't one of those managers. His obsession isn't defense, it's goals. And so far, Austin FC has just one to speak of. There are some caveats (or, if you prefer, excuses) to mention. The most glaring of which is that the club has not had Sebastián Driussi on the pitch yet this season. There was also some talk of slow, grabby turf at Lumen Field as well as a nasty Seattle weather forecast with temps in the high 30s and intermittent rain. But those details do little to justify the fact that Austin managed just two shots against Seattle's 23.

Fortunately for Austin, none of those 23 shots found the back of the net. A draw in Seattle is a positive result regardless of the circumstances, and Wolff chose to focus on that fact after the match rather than the lack of any attacking threat to speak of.

Fair enough. Fans don't have to like it, but a coach is well within his rights to accentuate the positive after his club earned its first point of the season and secured a hard-earned clean sheet. If every incomplete performance was met with abject negativity, he'd lose the locker room in a hurry. A decent portion of Austin FC's players, particularly defenders like Matt Hedges, left Seattle proud of how the club held firm in the face of constant pressure.

"Very proud of the work we put in tonight," Hedges emphasized. "As a back line and as a unit, we gained a lot of confidence from this performance."

Defensive midfielder Jhojan Valencia logged perhaps his best game as an Austin FC player, anchoring the club on both sides of the ball and earning himself a spot on MLS's team of the week.

If Wolff and his players can draw confidence from an unsightly stalemate in enemy territory, more power to them. But that confidence needs to translate on the pitch.

> As El Tree returns home for back-to-back tough matchups at Q2 Stadium, the bar of expectation goes up. Starting Saturday against 2023 Western Conference pacesetters St. Louis City, Austin FC simply has to find some kind of offensive stride.

Driussi's return would certainly help things, but one player shouldn't make or break an entire system. Josh Wolff must figure out

how to utilize the lesser – but still very capable – attacking players he has at his disposal. At the same time, those players need to step up and start making their coach look better than they have so far.

Gyasi Zardes, Diego Rubio, Jáder Obrian, and Ethan Finlay have all had plenty of MLS goalscoring success in years gone by. Emiliano Rigoni has scored goals in the UEFA Europa League. They are better than what they've shown donning the ATX "Armadillo Kit" this season.

This time, a scrappy 0-0 draw isn't going to cut it.



Really, the only unsuccessful dish we had that first night was the caramel dark chocolate mousse, which arrived garnished with a hazelnut crumble and chantilly cream. It was a very pretty dish, but the texture was off. It was very thick and dense, almost like a chilled chocolate ganache. We wondered whether they'd forgotten to fold in the whipped cream when assembling the dessert. On the other hand, the crème brûlée was very nice, with a crisp, caramelized top we all jockeyed to crack with the back of a spoon. Split four ways, it was a delightful end to a deeply satisfying meal.

First-Class French

Chef Jo Chan delivers delicious cuisine in former Hyde Park post office BY MELANIE HAUPT

I have lived in Central East Austin for nearly two decades and was a regular customer at the post office at 43rd and Speedway. So, I was less than pleased when its lease was not renewed and it closed in 2021, as there's really no other post office nearby half as convenient. That said, I'd be lying if I said I wasn't actually thrilled to have a bookstore, an upmarket bodega, and a French bistro occupying the space where I used to buy stamps and mail bills.

A partnership between former *Top Chef* contestant and Eberly Executive Chef Jo Chan and Tiny Grocer owner Steph Steele, Bureau de Poste inside Tiny Grocer anchors this exciting new development in a neighborhood prime for walkable amenities.

Four of us visited for an alfresco dinner on a very cold January night. We started with the Pommes Dauphine and endive salad. Of the pommes, the waiter explained that "they're kind of like bougie tater tots." (Narrator voice: *They were not like bougie tater tots.*) The four delicate, creamy potato croquettes were topped with fine herbs and a dollop of trout roe and served as a perfectly adequate amuse for the meal. The endive salad was spectacular: light and crisp, the bitter lettuce dancing gracefully with the tart citrus, the creamy comte cheese, and umami hazelnuts.

Our main courses were similarly delightful. My poisson à la plancha entrée, chosen out of a desire to make slightly more virtuous choices, comprised a beautifully seared fillet of cod. its luscious crust napped with a simple, elegant beurre blanc served alongside a small, lightly dressed green salad. I enjoyed every single bite, making sure to enjoy it slowly because it was a fairly modest portion. My spouse enjoyed his steak frites, a large boneless rib-eye cooked medium rare but with an expert char, served with a bright and kicky au poivre sauce.

My friend ordered the Bureau de Poste moules frites, a house recipe that departs from the classic preparation with a unique sauce made from tomatoes, bell pepper, and fennel; it was smoky and flavorful, complex but not overbearing. Her spouse ordered the duck leg cassoulet, which must have been delicious because he didn't share a single bite with any of us. (We all doubt his assertion that he felt bad about not sharing.) Most of our party opted for wine with our dinner; I started out with a glass of the Boxt red blend because I was curious about this Austin-based, woman-owned luxury wine brand. I quickly determined that it was not to my tastes, and so requested a glass of what my companions were having, the Presqu'ile pinot noir from Santa Barbara, California. It was much more to my liking, a muscular balance of earth and spice. Was it the right wine to pair with cod? Of course not, but I couldn't fathom drinking a chilled wine while dining outside in 30 degrees.

My family and I returned for Sunday brunch a few weeks later and had a similarly pleasant time. My picky teen ordered a buttery, caramelized kouign-amann pastry sourced from Swedish Hill, along with a side of bacon – her two favorite food groups. She tried the frozen Shirley Temple, which was delicious but very heavy on the lime. My spouse ordered the eggs Benedict, which is topped with perfectly poached eggs and Bayonne ham, and enjoyed it very much. (This is notable because he famously detests ham.) I opted for the classic moules frites, a generous mound (more than

two dozen) of bivalves swimming in a light, fragrant broth, served with a small side of fries and a few slices of baguette. The disproportionately small portion of frites/bread compared to the sharing-size portion of mussels was a little disappointing, but the flavors - garlic, butter, white wine - were spot on.

The highlight of the brunch for me, though, was the Cantratto spritz. The Italian aperitif, which is basically made for spritzing, is herbal and citrusy with a pop of licorice. I've been an Aperol spritz girlie for a few years now, but I think I have a new summer drink.

I can definitely see myself enjoying many more of these spritzes with my girlfriends on Bureau de Poste's lovely patio. Granted, our first introduction to it wasn't the best, because when making my (anonymous) reservation, the only seating options available had been outside. The host reassured us that the patio was heated, but it is really a patio with heaters and no wind breaks. The four of us were supplied with two high-quality serape blankets, but we were still pretty uncomfortable. That said, this is going to be the perfect spot come high patio weather, so make your reservations now.

In a gesture to the building's long history as a neighborhood post office, each table has a little flag on a rope that you can raise to summon a server, which is precious by half. If I'm raising a flag at a table in a restaurant, I'm

going to expect a refill of fresh sopapillas to appear forthwith. And anyway, a well-trained professional server isn't going to need those kinds of cutesy visual cues to provide spectacular service.

Chan has trained her front-of-house staff well, generally speaking. On our first visit, our waiter was a bit condescending and prone to mansplaining. At this price point and in this neighborhood, waitstaff would do well to assume prior knowledge on their diners' part. Once he realized we hadn't just arrived from Hicksville. he relaxed and was less pedantic. Our server at brunch was much more laid-back and confident, friendly and attentive without being overbearing, and definitely made me want to come back so we could hang out some more.

So, despite the fact that I have to go out of my way to mail a package or buy a stamp these days, I'm beyond pleased that Bureau de Poste occupies the former post office space. Chan and Steele have devised a winning combination with their partnership, offering an intimate and convivial space to dine and shop.



Grin and Bear It 📼

A kung fu panda searches for his successor in this middling sequel BY RICHARD WHITTAKER

How long can high-kicking and dumpling-loving Po (voiced by Jack Black) remain the Dragon Warrior? That's the question that starts the fourth theatrical feature in the *Kung Fu Panda* animated series, and it's answered quickly by his mentor, the irascible Master Shifu (Dustin Hoffman). The constantly exasperated teacher explains that his protégé's time as a butt-kicker is nearly over, as he must become more of a spiritual leader for the anthropomorphic creatures that inhabit the Valley of Peace.

Fortunately for Po, he doesn't have to choose a successor from among his close friends, as the Furious Five are all ... away doing other good deeds offscreen. This makes it blindingly obvious that the story is setting up the conveniently newly arrived pickpocket fox Zhen (Awkwafina) as the next Dragon Warrior, because she's basically the only other character with lines. Of course she has to overcome her roguish ways, which means dealing with new villain the Chameleon (Viola Davis), a shape-shifting lizard crime lord with predictable plans for world domination.

Maybe the Furious Five aren't the only thing that's missing. In the 16 years, two sequels, and three episodic spin-offs (the excellent *Legends of Awesomeness* and the perfectly fine *Paws of Destiny* and *The Dragon Knight*) since the 2008 original, the world of Po has become surprisingly deep and rich. So while it may seem nitpicky to complain about the absence of Lady Tiger, a sequel without her seems somehow lesser. The films have always been warmly touching, and so depriving Po of his de facto family deflates that sensation. The fuzzy fighter became a beloved character not because of Black's funny delivery, but because he imbued the furry fanboy with a heartfelt charm. That's only here in flashes, and those moments are incredibly welcome.

Yes, there are some chortles to be had from some of the sight gags (Po falling off. into, or over something will never not elicit a chuckle). Yet the film feels most Kung Fu Panda-ish when he's not there, and instead the story focuses on his two dads, biological father Li Shan (a charmingly goofy Bryan Cranston) and adoptive goose noodle-slinger Mr. Ping (the inimitable James Hong). The easy path would be to have them overcome their differences to rescue their boy. Instead, the script by series creators Jonathan Aibel and Glenn Berger, and franchise newcomer Darren Lemke (who put words into Black's mouth for Goosebumps) makes them good friends and doting fathers, at points literally lifting each other up.

Po falling off, into, or over something will never not elicit a chuckle.

But that main story feels both laden down with the series' history and bereft of it. Sure, the kids will giggle, and the animation is well-executed (even if there does seem to be something a little off around the eyes in this version of Po) but it just doesn't land with that same ebullient skadoosh. If this truly is the end of Po's journey as the Dragon Warrior, and he can finally embrace change, then maybe the story should have felt more like the end of an era. Dreamworks closed the *How to Train Your Dragon* trilogy with exactly such bittersweet resonance in *The Hidden World*: by comparison, this parting of the ways feels more like a wandering off.

A Garden of Vegetal Delights

VISUAL ARTS

Malou Flato explores the natural world in "Greatest Hits" exhibition BY WAYNE ALAN BRENNER

The life of plants and their gambits of sustenance and reproduction provide human eves with some of the more wonderful sights in this world. So many diverse biological systems evolved toward the miracles of photosynthesis and pollination, now long supplying our planet's collection of creatures with food, with the very air we need to survive - and all that botanical splendor is the embodiment of forms following such function.

Artists, too, provide visions for viewing, often delighting senses in ways that help to make life a pleasure beyond merely surviving in it, and sometimes - perhaps inevitably - an artist will choose to express the beauty of our natural world, the landscapes, the bright floral exuberance of whatever a biome can support. This is what Malou Flato does.

Born in Corpus Christi in 1953 and now living and working in Austin (with a second studio on her great-grandfather's ranch in the Texas Hill Country's Edwards County), Flato causes a world of flowers and more to bloom where only blank walls were before, meticulously applying pigment to surface, rendering intimate images of botany at the edge of hyperrealism.

"A teacher of mine, Roberto Juarez, introduced me to a Japanese paper that appears translucent," the artist notes on her website. "I paint both sides and guide the colors as they bleed through - you see all the paint on both sides. The paper seems to disappear and is just a vehicle that holds paint."

Flato - who has also worked in costume design, printmaking, digital prints, ceramic tiles, and sculpture throughout her career - has, with this newest solo show at Davis Gallery, moved beyond paper and brought her renditions even further in terms of permanence and size. The artist's "Greatest Hits" exhibition. which runs through April 6, displays a panoply of paintings - stunning portraits of cacti, succulents, deciduous flowering trees, lupines (the beloved Texas bluebonnets), and more and each of the plants is captured via Flato's well-practiced brushes in oil on canvas, 5-footby-6-foot canvas, turning the Davis Gallery's tony but welcoming interior into a polychrome garden of vegetal delights.

The level of accuracy in these painted creations is, frankly, astonishing at times. One wishes to move in close, to make sure that the hi-res effect of the thick crimson fruits in Flato's Tasajillo, for instance, isn't the result of digital or photographic wizardry; but one hesitates, not wanting to get too near and thus be impaled on the long thin spikes jutting from the cactus' branches. This is twodimensional work? That seems capable of drawing blood? Ouch - that's realism.

And this gallery-gathered garden isn't populated with plants from some far-flung corner of the globe, but with plants that are, so to speak, among our cherished friends and neighbors here in the Lone Star State. If you've ever hiked your way over Enchanted Rock or other parts of the Hill Country - or, hell, if you've merely paid attention to what's growing around you in Austin's somewhat more asphalt-cloaked neighborhoods - this "Greatest Hits" show will reward you with an occasional thrill of recognition: "Hey, I know that guy! That's a Pride of Barbados, like the one in my Tía Isabel's front vard!"

"Texas is my inspiration," says Flato, in the exhibition's notes. "I have made my life here, and I would like to think that my art reflects the place I know best - and that maybe I'm adding something worthy to the visual and cultural scenery."

We can affirm - and you can see for yourself, citizen, at Davis Gallery right now - that Malou Flato is adding something very worthy indeed.

At Besame Mucho, a Latin Music Capital Por Nosotros

Inside the all-star, vaquero-chic, 84-band, Spanish-language spectacle BY RAOUL HERNANDEZ

Booked like first-year Lollapalooza and staged à la ACL Fest, Circuit of the Americas' Latin music eclipse, Besame Mucho on March 2, manifested a first for Austin and who knows where else: an alternate reality. Brown music for brown people, tens of thousands of them, of US – ustedes, nosotros – in every size and shape and skin tone, and not one dressed down for an all-star Spanish-language spectacle as deep and vast as a Hill Country night.

Running 11am-11pm and listing 84 acts on four stages, the racetrack concert site still comes off as largely inhospitable. As far back as Mayhem Fest one apocalyptic August in 2013 at the then-Austin360 Amphitheater, the terrain blew a cloud of dust and grit akin to festival staging in a rock quarry. A decade hasn't improved conditions much, but the footprint for Besame Mucho proved largely brilliant.

Enclosing a large but never sloggy roundabout, way better and more diverse food booths in the ACL style formed an outside circle to the grounds, with bars either accompanying or dividing up the stage quadrants of three headliner platforms and a slightly smaller fourth one. All employed revolving stages resembling those used on rodeo floors: spin the band! One set finishes, dudes clear the cables and outcroppings, and the whole riser revolves to reveal another ready-to-go Latin superstar.

Case in point: switchover from Spanish folk metallers Mägo de Oz to Argentine altrockers Enanitos Verdes on the Rockero stage went off more like a magic trick. What some assumed was an encore of the former band actually kicked off the latter group. Madrid's Jethro Tull/Iron Maiden mix transitioned to Rock en Español anthems spanning 45 years in the blink of an eye.

Enanitos Verdes ventures here more than most, but playing to their native demographic, they could hardly be heard over the audience harmonizing. That proved the case for all headliners starting at dusk. Casual observers appeared few and far amongst the Latinate born and bred into this music.

Even in a state where country music dominates, urban sophisticates get antsy in a large gathering of hat-wearing Southwesterners. At Besame Mucho, cowboy hats rivaled any C&W summit, yet the contemporary vaquero look – women in shorts and boots, and Far left: Caifanes performs on the Rockero stage

men sporting sunglasses and open shirts – strutted and preened with head-swiveling chic in comparison to most REI-assisted festgoers of the boomer and/or collegial set. Carnaval-sized Day of the Dead decor rose equally striking all over the grounds, including a 20-foot red and undead chihuahua sitting between the Las Clasicas and Te Gusta el Pop? stages.

Chilean slickers La Ley thinned out Enanitos' boomer choir with Nineties arena rock, so a trip to El Pop uncorked Sin Bandera. Mexico City duo of brains (Leonel Garcia) and beauty (Argentine hunk Noel Schajris), they roused aspirational balladry in the musical vicinity of Christian pop. The former held down the band as the latter shucked his shirt and parted the crowd with his sculpted torso.



Mexican rap-metal legacy Molotov lit the fuse on the Rockero stage, concentrating a sea of leather-wearers with swaggering riffs and beats. Raging against the machine one electroclash moment then pulling back proto-tropically the next, they headbanged throughout. 1997's "Puto" bounced thousands like a trampoline.

Over on Las Clasicas, El Tri mainstay Alex Lora also brought out the "puto" for a throng of native speakers. Dressed in Eighties leathers like Scorpions bandleader Klaus Meine, the Puebla-born pottymouth, 71, yowled like an alley cat in manner befitting a Mexican institution reaching back to the late Seventies and once called their country's Rolling Stones. Then again, "Triste Canción de Amor" brought out the cell lights, and in a luchador mask, Lora rasped a snippet of the festival's theme song.

Grammy-winning accordion king Ramón Ayala, 78, held court there next, disarming the swelling masses with a swooning romanticism in standards such as "Rinconcito en el Cielo," "Cuando Yo Era un Jovencito," and "Tragos Amargos." Fellow Ciudad de Mexico hit men Café Tacuba, who played the second Lollapalooza in 1992, similarly electrified a younger demographic with buoyant and trademark pop existentialism courting a timelessness reminiscent of the Cure, Depeche Mode, and the Smiths.

Mexican rock rarity Caifanes followed on the Rockero stage by working the nuanced edges of guitar-driven New Wave, while ladies ruled the Pop platform. Monterrey-born Gloria Trevi stomped mainstage divahood while shucking outfit layers like a nesting doll. Lake Charles twosome Ha*Ash pranced and pounded a keyboard or two, and Alejandra Guzman ignited power ballads courting Bonnie Tyler's "Total Eclipse of the Heart."

Six hours vested and temperature dropping, we trekked the mile-plus back to the car, missing Juanes and Los Tigres del Norte, but awed by a glimpse at an alternative Texas, an alternate sonic dimension, and the ever-universal convergence of live music capitalists in Austin, Texas.




