

FAYETTE FAIL

Dear Editor,

I returned to "Why Austin Can't Seem to Quit its Despised Coal Plant" [News, Dec. 1, 2023] after Austin Energy General Manager Bob Kahn's memorandum on March 8 communicated yet another delay in the process of exiting the Fayette Power Project. The article had expressed the likelihood of this outcome but offered a somewhat hopeful perspective on the work of advocacy groups to prevent it. Though Kahn's memo does present some great potential courses of action, including AE issuing RFPs to gather data around carbon-free generation technologies, the fight to make Austin fully carbon-free in little more than a decade seems increasingly less promising.

As a student at UT-Austin, I initially found this article compelling for its discussion of Fayette's water usage and LCRA's calls for consumer-led conservation amid increasingly dire droughts. A *Daily Texan* article, also published March 8, similarly discussed increasing energy bills despite similar or decreasing energy usage. It seems incredibly unfair that consumers face the consequences of Fayette's continued operation, and as this summer once again spikes water and energy demand, I agree that consumers should make themselves aware of the amount of water that could be made available by closing the plant.

The memo's mention of sharing a common goal brought my attention back to the lack of public influence on LCRA. It will be up to the Legislature to take action regarding LCRA, but I think the discussed financial deterrent may not be convincing enough if even Sierra Club's lawsuit last summer could not make it a breakpoint.

Ultimately, delaying the Resource, Generation, and Climate Protection plan will help only if the revised plan actually realizes the exit from Fayette. As Mayor Kirk Watson stated in his newsletter, "there's nothing we can do ... that's more profound or effective in combating climate change than getting us out of that plant." Saniya Koppikar


ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT

Speaking of impunity, American journalist Evan Gershkovich woke up to his second year in a Russian prison last week. The U.S. government officially designated him as "wrongfully detained" within two weeks of his arrest, and President Joe Biden said in a new statement that he will "never give up hope" for the reporter's release. As dozens of journalists have also been killed in Gaza with no consequences since the conflict began, Vox dubbed 2024 "a very bad year for press freedom." Vox wrote that while wartime reporting has never been safe, "until a decade ago or so, there was at least a sense that journalists had a recognized role in reporting from even the world's worst conflicts and that role afforded them some protection."

First-Ever Appraisal District Election Is Small Battle in GOP-Dem War **Over Taxation in Texas**

Elected Dem- or GOP-backed candidates would have outsized power over district

For the first time ever, voters across Texas will be asked to elect some of the people who will serve on the obscure oversight boards that play a critical role in the state's property tax system. Some in Travis County fear the May 4 election could allow Republicans to gain power in what is a staunchly Democratic county.

Pooja Sethi, the newly elected chair of Travis County's Democratic Party, did not mince words about the stakes of the May election. "It could impact how our schools

are funded, access to our parks and libraries. and the ability for our cities and counties to provide services and amenities residents depend on," said Sethi, who also serves as chief of staff to state Rep. Vikki Goodwin.



HEADLINES CONTINUED

TESLA VS. H-E-B SHOWDOWN: Tesla is the largest tech employer in the Austin area, but after rapid growth it could become the largest local private-sector employer overall. At 22,777 employees at the Gigafactory, it's only a couple hundred jobs away from beating H-E-B out. H-E-B also projects growth, though, and could employ around 60,000 people in the near future, the *Austin Business Journal* reported.

UT LAYS OFF DEI STAFF: At least 60 people

in Diversity, Equity and Inclusion-related positions lost their jobs at UT-Austin this week as a direct result of the university's implementation of Senate Bill 17, which bans DEI initiatives in institutions of higher education. This followed a March 26 letter from state Sen. Brandon Creighton, R-Conroe, to chancellors and regents at various universities, which threatened frozen funding for universities that are "merely renaming DEI offices or positions." Read more online.

MICROCHIP CAPITAL: UT-Austin, Austin Community College, and Texas Institute for Electronics are partnering to develop a joint Semiconductor Training Center. The new center will coordinate instruction in every "skill set on the semiconductor workforce continuum," the group said, and let students receive hands-on technical training as well as theory. About 115,000 new semiconductor jobs are expected to be added in the U.S. by 2030, UT's press release said.

FREE SCHOOL: Monday, Austin Community College's Board of Trustees approved a fiveyear pilot program that will offer free tuition and fees for students who graduate from high school this year and enroll at ACC in the fall. A steal!



WHAT ARE YOU VOTING ON, EXACTLY?

Appraisal districts play a key role in determining what a property owner's tax bill looks like every year and how much revenue local governments have to work with. City Council members, county commissioners, and school board trustees are responsible for setting tax rates, but those rates are applied to property values determined by the appraisal district.

Republican legislators opposed to higher taxes authored and passed Senate Bill 2 last year, which turned three of these previously appointed positions into elected ones, and the two Republican candidates who have filed in this race have lengthy public records

opposing taxation and government spending (except on policing). Both declined interviews with the *Chronicle*. One of the liberal candidates, Daniel Wang, put Democrats' concerns simply: "The GOP wants to defund local government.

to defund local government. Screwing up the appraisal process is one way they could achieve that goal."

Voters will now elect three officials on the board of directors for the Travis Central Appraisal District – the frequently criticized third-party organization that assesses the property values that local governments use to set tax rates. (These elections will only occur in counties with more than 75,000 people, as is laid out in SB 2.)

Historically, the appraisal district's board has had two core responsibilities: hiring the chief appraiser who runs the district and approving the district's budget. But now, they will also appoint members to the Appraisal Review Board – the group of volunteers who settle disputes between property owners and district appraisers over assessed property values.

DO REPUBLICANS HAVE A CHANCE IN DEEP-BLUE TRAVIS COUNTY?

This election will be for just three technically nonpartisan seats on TCAD's board. It's likely to be a low-information, low-turnout election – that is, the kind of electoral environment that is strongly favorable to the Republican party.

The two anti-tax Republican candidates in these races are former Austin City Council member and serial election loser Don Zimmerman, who has filed for Place 1, and Travis County Republican Party chair and Save Austin Now co-founder Matt Mackowiak for Place 2. Jonathan Patschke, treasurer for the Travis County Libertarian Party, and Bill May, who has no public campaign materials, are running for the Place 2 and 3 seats, respectively.

Meanwhile, the Travis County Democratic Party made a concerted effort to recruit candidates for the three seats on the ballot. Jett Hanna, an attorney with experience in commercial real estate law who served on TCAD's board from 1988-1990, will run for Place 1; Daniel Wang, an Austin native who has worked as an attorney in the energy sector since graduating from law school in 2020, for Place 2; and Dick Lavine, perhaps the most qualified candidate imaginable for one of these positions, for Place 3, Lavine has been a widely respected budget and school finance guru at the Texas Capitol for decades who served on TCAD's board of directors from 1997-2018. TCDP has endorsed all three.

The three Democrat-backed candidates share strikingly similar campaign platforms that promise to ensure the work at TCAD remains fair and accurate.

THE POTENTIAL TO MANIPULATE APPRAISALS

Beyond fairness to taxpayers, Wang, Lavine, and Hanna all warn that inaccurate appraisals can affect school funding. Regularly, the Texas comptroller conducts an audit known as the Property Value Study to assess the accuracy of a district's appraisals. If "local values" in Travis County are more than 5% off from "state values," the comptroller can make Austin ISD pay the state more money into the recapture system.

Another path to undermining the appraisal process lies through that volunteer Appraisal Review Board. SB 2 changed its selection process to require

appointments receive a majority vote from the appraisal district board, including two of the elected members – giving the electeds an effective veto over the full board. (It means a hypothetical volunteer that received a

7-2 vote would fail, if the two nay votes were elected directors.)

"The veto power given to elected directors is a real Trojan horse," Lavine said. "That's where the mischief could really occur."

Bettencourt has defended the new law as a way of holding districts accountable, but state Rep. Gina Hinojosa warned that it could be part of the Texas GOP's broader attack on the state's property tax system. "There's no doubt in my mind that including these elections in the property tax bill was a calculated effort to bring in more conservative and Republican viewpoints into the taxation process," Hinojosa told us. "In Travis County, we run the risk of the chaos agents who run things at the Legislature having a hand in how we make local decisions related to funding for public schools, parks, and libraries."

SCHOOL BUS CRASH INVOLVED

COCAINE: The driver of a cement truck that crossed the median and plowed into a San Marcos school bus on March 22 had tested positive on drug tests three times in recent years, according to documents obtained by KVUE. The impact of the crash caused the bus carrying dozens of preschool kids to roll over, killing a Tom Green Elementary student and a driver in a vehicle behind the bus and injuring 51 others. On March 29, 42-year-old Jerry Hernandez was arrested and charged with criminally negligent homicide after allegedly admitting that he had used cocaine and slept only three hours the night before the crash.

WOMAN SUES OVER ABORTION

MURDER CASE: A Texas woman arrested for a self-induced abortion in 2022 is suing Starr County District Attorney Gocha Allen Ramirez and Assistant District Attorney Alexandria Lynn Barrera for more than \$1 million, alleging that the "humiliation of a highly publicized indictment and arrest" has "permanently affected her standing in the community," The Texas Tribune reported. A subsequent State Bar of Texas investigation found that the Starr County D.A. "sought to pursue criminal homicide charges against an individual for acts clearly not criminal." Ramirez paid a \$1,250 fine and his license has been suspended for one year.

DAMN SCOOTERS: Austin has implemented a raft of new restrictions on the use of electric scooters. Effective April 1, the total number of scooters allowed in the city will be reduced from 9,000 to 7,000. The Downtown number will be halved, from 4,000 to 2,000. And the maximum speed limit for scooters will decrease from 15 to 10 miles per hour. In the future, the city will allow exceptions to the restrictions during SXSW and other large events.

Another Hays County Jail Inmate Fears Losing Use of Limb as He Waits for Medical Care

After a bone break, he wants a second surgery BY BRANT BINGAMON

Hays County Jail administrators have been repeatedly accused of providing inadequate medical care to their inmates in recent years. In August of 2022, the *Chronicle* reported on the case of Ranulfo Benitez-Morales, who feared he would lose his leg after delays in treatment for a wound suffered during his arrest. A month later, we examined the case of Melvin Nicholas, who said he nearly died awaiting treatment for diabetes. In January 2023, we reported on John Thomas, who complained that authorities did not properly treat his liver disease.

Now, a new case has surfaced which echoes these stories. Mark Suniga, 47, has been sitting in the Hays County Jail since August of 2022 after being arrested on a charge of indecency with a child. Suniga's fiancée, Belinda Rodriguez, told us he is a diabetic who had already had two toes amputated and is unsteady on his feet. So, Rodriguez said, Suniga asked that he not be placed in a top bunk when he was incarcerated. But he was, and on March 20 of last year he faltered as he tried to climb down for an insulin shot, making a misstep and coming down hard on the heel of his left foot.

"He went to medical and told them he felt something pop and it was hurting him really bad," Rodriguez said. "The nurse checked him out and said, 'You're good, go back to your cell and I'll put a word in to the doctor." But by the time he got to his cell, the bone had already punctured out of his skin and he was bleeding." Rodriguez said Suniga was taken to the hospital, where doctors placed two screws in the side of his foot in a multi-hour operation. He returned to jail several days later with a boot on the foot. He spent weeks trying not to place any weight on the foot but tripped again in late June and once more felt stabbing pain in his foot. Jail authorities sent him to get an X-ray, Rodriguez said, and it showed that the screws in his foot had loosened. The foot soon developed an abscess.

geon," Rodriguez said. "And the surgeon told him that he would do a surgery within the next week, because he needed it done ASAP before the wound closed. He said he was gonna take the tendon and put it to the bottom of his foot and then he would at least have some movement. But the jail never

approved the appointment for the surgery. I guess the doctor was too expensive. That's what one of the guards told him – they didn't approve it because it was too expensive."

Hays County Sheriff Gary Cutler told us in an emailed statement that the department is aware of Rodriguez's allegations but is unable to comment because of federal law that restricts the sharing of confidential medical information. Rodriguez said Suniga saw a third surgeon this February, and that by then the abscess had closed and the surgeon gave him two options: "Either put on a boot and he'll never walk on that foot again. Or go with the surgery and reconstruct everything again because they waited so long to do the surgery," she said. "But there's been no word on any second surgery."

According to Rodriguez, Suniga has been offered plea deals, which he has refused in order to clear his name in court.

Suniga's bond is set at \$150,000, and Rodriguez estimated that he would need to raise \$30,000, a sum he can't afford, to be released from jail so he could seek medical care on the outside. His trial was reset for the second time on March 4. As he waits, he's using a walker,

keeping weight off his foot, and hoping the county will make a decision on a surgery.

"They should have provided it a long time ago," Rodriguez said. "I don't know if they're not doing it because they want to wait for him to get out – because they're not liable once he gets out. But I'm thinking about doing a lawsuit on them. I mean, he went in there walking and now he's coming out and can't use his foot? It just doesn't make sense."

Austin ISD Ponders College Readiness at Area High Schools

Good examples are out there - can they be replicated?

Austin ISD wrapped up its look at the college readiness of the district's high schoolers March 28 at a meeting of the board of trustees. The takeaway was the same as three weeks earlier – there has been a dip in the number of students who are ready for college or a career, and the district is scrambling to improve performance.

College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) is a major emphasis in Texas public schools, and students demonstrate it in a variety of ways – by completing dual-credit courses that earn college hours, by earning an associate degree or an industry-based certification, or joining the U.S. armed forces, among many other things.

One of the district's CCMR goals is for the percentage of students who are on track to earn at least 12 college credit hours to increase from 9.8% in August 2021 to 25% by August 2026. The data presented at the meeting showed that the percentage of students likely to meet this metric has actually dipped from previous years – only 8.4% of students in grades 9-12 are on track to earn 12 or more college credit hours this school year. Seven percent of economically disadvantaged high schoolers are on track to do so.

Another district goal is for the percentage of students on track to earn an industry-based certification to increase marginally by August 2026. These certifications prepare students for a huge variety of jobs in nursing, construction, computer programming, and many other fields. Similarly, the percentage of 11th and 12th grade students on track to earn one of these certifications this year is lower than it was in 2021, but here, economically disadvantaged students are getting more certifications than kids in wealthier families.

Administrators identified several root causes for the relatively low numbers, including a lack of alignment between instruction and testing and the absence in the

district of a comprehensive case management system. They expressed the hope they could get a case management system in place by the next school year.

In the discussion that followed, Trustee Kevin Foster noted that some high schools are doing better than others on CCMR and asked what could be taken from them. **Creslond Fannin**, executive director of Early College High School, discussed an approach at Navarro Early College High, which has created a dual-credit "college transitions" course. Students at Navarro may take the course just after entering high school, rather than having to wait until they're juniors. "We're hopeful that many of our other campuses will be able to do that as well," Fannin said.

Superintendent **Matias Segura** reframed a question from Foster about how to replicate Navarro's success: "If you were to expand the program to other early college high schools, what might be required that you don't currently have?" "Money," responded **Angel Wilson**, assistant superintendent of secondary schools, drawing laughter. Wilson then praised Navarro's new principal, **Steve Covin**, and also spoke glowingly of Akins Early College High.

"One of the things that happens when I talk to parents, there is just the absolute love they have for the school, the love they have for the community," Foster said. "It's an overwhelming, repeated experience that always, for me, raises this question: How is it that someone just got here from Afghanistan and it's their second year and they've come so far and are doing so well?"

Wilson said the first thing that came to her mind was teacher retention. "We want to be able to not only attract and recruit great talent, but to be able to keep that talent in that campus," Wilson said. "Because that's what makes it unique, that's what makes it flourish." – BRANT BINGAMON

WE KNEW IT ALL ALONG: For the past three years, the social media commentator known as Evil MoPac has encouraged his followers to complete a March Madnessstyle bracket naming Austin's worst drivers. This year, Evil MoPac is asking them to identify which neighborhoods they come from. Since March 21, followers on X have been voting to narrow down the worst of the worst. As of publication, Westlake and Lakeway were battling it out for the title.

PANDEMIC, THE SEQUEL?: Last week we told you about the first case of bird flu in a Texas cow. The first human case of bird flu in Texas was reported on April 1, according to a statewide health alert. The person who became ill had been in contact with cows. Symptoms of bird flu are similar to flus you've had, but Vox reports that of the 800 people who have tested positive in the U.S. over the last 20 years, half died. Health care providers who encounter people who may have the virus should immediately consult their local health department, according to the alert.

TEXAS PAYING EXTREMISTS TO BUS

MIGRANTS: The Southern Poverty Law Center reported this week that a contractor for Texas' anti-immigrant program Operation Lone Star appears to have paid an extremist group to bus migrants in inhumane conditions. Texas has spent many millions busing migrants in recent years and, according to a review by SPLC of government contracts obtained through an open records request, Wynne Transportation paid the anti-government organization Mayhem Solutions over \$20 million for busing services. The SPLC describes Mayhem as "a border-focused antigovernment extremist organization [which] illegally promotes its private security and investigation services."

MESSY GANNETT NEWS: Gannett

 the Statesman's corporate overlord – made headlines last week
 when CEO Mike Reed said the union "plays dirty." The Austin Business Journal reported this week that Reed
 was awarded a 14% raise last year
 while the median pay for employees
 dropped by 3.4%. Overall, his pay was
 76 times that of the company's median employee salary.

EAST AUSTIN CAT TO REUNITE WITH **OWNERS:** Now for some real news – an East Austin couple is expecting the return of their cat. Hans. who disappeared for two months and was assumed dead. According to reporting by KXAN, Doug and Monet Bennett roamed their neighborhood after Hans disappeared in late January, calling for him and putting up posters. When Hans wasn't found, the Bennetts were devastated. Then, on March 27, an animal control officer found Hans in an abandoned house, where he had dropped from 17 pounds to 7. Hans is being nursed back to health and his owners expect to have him home in the coming days.

Project Connect's Paxton Problem

As new cost estimate and timeline are revealed, the project faces potential delays from the A.G. and a lawsuit

It's become increasingly dubious since 2020 whether or not Austin's major transit overhaul, Project Connect, will ever get built – mostly thanks to ballooning cost estimates and, more recently, a legal challenge by a group of prominent citizens, supported by Attorney General Ken Paxton. Still, last week, the Austin Transit Partnership released an updated cost estimate and timeline for Project Connect's scaleddown first leg of rail construction. But if ATP loses an upcoming court case that goes to trial in May, it could delay the project into next year, at which point anti-Austin lawmakers could take an axe to the project in the next legislative session.

In 2022, ATP had to halve their planned 20.2 miles of light rail, subway, and new rapid bus routes to a now 9.8-mile line, with no subway and no lines to the airport, all thanks to climbing costs from design changes and inflation. This stretch of rail is now estimated to cost \$7.1 billion by 2033, with construction set to start in 2027. In 2022, the estimate was \$4.8 billion, but ATP stresses this most recent increase accounts for rising inflation in 2033 dollars, not an actual increase in project costs. The estimate in future dollars was a requirement for receiving at least a 50% match in grant funding from the Federal Transit Administration.

A group of prominent plaintiffs – including Travis County Commissioner Margaret Gómez, former state Sen. Gonzalo Barrientos, and burger restaurant Dirty Martin's – filed suit against the project in November 2023, claiming that because voters did not approve the new design, the city can't issue debt or spend property taxes to pay for the project. Paxton issued an opinion last month that said ATP can't legally issue bonds as a nonprofit and that it can't use "maintenance and operations" taxes – the portion of the city's tax rate that voters agreed to increase in 2020 for Project Connect – to finance debt, like bonds.

The A.G. must approve any entity that wants to issue debt in the state, but ATP has asked for a bond

validation election in Travis County district court that can override the A.G.'s disapproval and expedite the legal process, which could have otherwise taken two years. Now, the trial is set for May 28-30. The judge will make a decision on both the Dirty Martin's lawsuit and the bond validation – but the plaintiffs and Paxton have attempted to delay the process before then by requesting multiple hearings.

On April 10, the plaintiffs are requesting a hearing to compel ATP to produce specific financial details, and on April 26, there will be a hearing on whether Travis County even has the jurisdiction to approve a bond validation election. Even if the judge were to side with ATP on the latter point, Paxton would likely appeal, which would delay the trial further, perhaps even into next year. So ATP claims that jurisdiction should be considered as part of the May trial's merit arguments. If ATP loses the May case, they'll start their own appeals process.

Part of why Paxton seems so keen to delay the trial might be to get to the next legislative session, which may prove the biggest threat to Project Connect. Last May, Paxton released an opinion saying essentially the same thing as last month's. Republican state Sen. Paul Bettencourt used it to bolster House Bill 3899, which would have derailed the project if passed. It was quashed with the help of certain Republican committee chairs – but they either lost or went to a run-off after the March primary election, thanks to Paxton's well-financed opposition.

If the case is delayed until the next legislative session, it could face the organized ire of anti-Austin Republicans again. Still, ATP is confident their case will hold up in court come May 28: "In 2020, Proposition A received overwhelming support – nearly 60% – to develop a rapid transit system. ATP is confident in our standing to petition the court in a bond validation action," Casey Burack, executive vice president of legal affairs for ATP, told the *Chronicle*. – LINA FISHER

Elizabeth Morris: 100 Years of Memories in Austin

Of back porches, corrupt politicians, and fireworks at Zilker

Elizabeth Randerson Morris does not seem 105. She only quit driving at age 99, soon after selling her house. These days, you can find her keeping up with the news in her comfortable room at Brookdale Senior Living in Round Rock, just about 14 miles from where she was born in Austin. She admits to getting tired after lunch, but her mind is sharp. If you ask her about Austin in the 1920s, she can see it.

She remembers baking pies each Saturday. She remembers being caked in dirt after hours playing with her brothers outside. She remembers sitting with her siblings on their screened-in back porch in East Austin each evening and listening to their grandmother's stories. That grandmother came to Texas from Alabama as a little girl in a covered wagon, so her stories were full of rangers and American Indians. She described being in the woods, seeing a dog, and going up to it so she could pet him, before realizing that the animal was, in fact, a crouching Indigenous Texan wearing a furry hide. Where that side of Elizabeth's family settled in Rocksprings, they grew vegetables, kept chickens, and fed themselves. There's a photo of them, sitting stoic outside. "They weren't easygoing," Elizabeth said. "They were tough."

That back porch where she learned about her grandmother's life is the setting of many of Elizabeth's early memories. It was the early 1920s when her family moved into their big house in the Pecan Springs neighborhood. It had a metal roof that boomed when it rained, and no bathroom – just an outside Johnny, and a wash basin that the kids would bathe in each evening by a wood stove. The road to their house was named after her father, a postman, because the area was so rural that to build a house, they had to build the road first.

At night, her brothers slept on the back porch. But Elizabeth shared a bedroom with her grandmother, who didn't want to sleep alone. Through the walls young Elizabeth would listen to her parents talk politics. As she remembers it, they were always in agreement, and their focus was always local. "They were not for the Fergusons," Morris said, laughing.

Elizabeth said she couldn't remember the specifics of their gripes, but we know the Fergusons were highly controversial at the time. James Ferguson was an anti-Klan and anti-prohibitionist ("wet") governor whose time in office from 1915 to 1917 was marked by corruption. Ferguson was ultimately indicted, impeached, and barred from holding further Texas office. So his wife Miriam "Ma" Ferguson picked up the baton, running for governor in 1924. During rallies, she simply introduced her husband and let him take the platform. She won, despite the fact that many suffragists opposed her, and many pro-Klan Democrats crossed party lines to vote for her Republican opponent.

"I had a chance, one time, to pour tea at the Governor's Mansion," Elizabeth said. "And I went over and poured tea one day at a party. And [my parents] thought it was very nice that I did, but that I shouldn't have gone to that one."

Her parents were Methodists who she thinks were, in hindsight, very lenient, though Elizabeth grew up thinking the opposite. They danced at home but worried about Elizabeth attending school dances. (She went dancing anyway, of course.) She also had the notion that they thought movies were "bad," but that might have just been an idea that her Victorian grandmother stuck in her head. "My brother and I sneaked off one day and went to a movie. I don't remember which. And I told my mother and she said, 'Well why didn't you tell me? I would've said that you could go.""

Even though Elizabeth loved to dance, she didn't meet her future husband at a party. She said they partnered up in a chemistry class at Austin High School

trying to do."

on 12th and Rio Grande. Her first impression: "Well, I thought he was pretty good."

At that time, Elizabeth was still wearing clothes made by her mother, Dimple. That was about to change. In 1935, Elizabeth became a local model. At the high-end department store T.H. Williams at 500-502 Congress Ave., she made \$11 per week wear-

ing their new ensembles and walking around the store – which concerned her father. "He said, 'I don't think you need to work right now.' And I said, 'Well Daddy, I just want to." He didn't fight with her about it, but it was Dale, her boyfriend from chemistry, who picked her up and drove her home after work.

She said their first real date saw them shooting fireworks off at Zilker Park. And then there were more dates. "First, we rode bicycles. And then we went skating." she said. They didn't go Downtown much, but if they did they walked on the side of the street designated for white Austinites.

After graduating high school in 1936, Elizabeth left for finishing school in Kentucky. "I had two roommates. The two of them cried all night long, every night – crying for mommy and daddy. And they lived about 30 miles from the school while I went clear across to Kentucky. So I got to move down by the dining room and have a room by myself. I thought it was pretty nice." Did Elizabeth cry? Nope. "I enjoyed it."

After a year in Kentucky, Elizabeth studied home economics at UT, and Dale was ready to join the war effort. In 1941, she quit school and they married. Soon, he was flying soldiers and ammunition from Detroit to Africa, England, and France. Two of her brothers were across the Atlantic in the war, too.

Dale and her brothers all survived the war – though one brother's close call deserves its own article. It was in 1962 that Elizabeth's life turned upside down. "Dale just came home from work one day and he said, my stomach is killing me. I took him to the hospital and went to the airport and picked up my mother and by time I got back to the hospital, he was dead. It had a rupture, but they didn't know what to do with him. So he died in '62."

The youngest of their three sons was just starting first grade, and 44-year-old Elizabeth, having spent two decades out of the workforce, found herself starting over.

It was her father who helped her find a path forward. He called up a longtime friend at the Dunaway School of Accounting, and the experience would change Elizabeth's life. The family friend allowed her to take classes

in the morning and work for him in the afternoon so she could make money to support her family as she worked through school. She described her boss even taking time to deliver things to her home. "It was just a different Austin," Elizabeth said. "It was a hometown."

Despite her massive loss, she said life raising her sons was good. "We had a nice place to live. I d was pratty good"

thought the world was pretty good." Elizabeth said Austin stopped feeling like home in the early Nineties; 1991 was the year she ended her subscription to the *Statesman*, after getting the paper all her life. Everything in its pages felt too negative, she said. "At that time, I said, that's it. I just couldn't do it."

For Austinites today who care to listen, her advice to live life well is simple: "I'm just telling everybody, just take it easy and slow. Enjoy life. That's what I'm trying to do. Sometimes you can't do what you want, but sometimes you have to do what you have to do."

NANÉ DAY REVISITED

Austin group returns to Empire April 7, two years after Daniel Sahad's death

The last time Ian Green played guitar for Nané was one of the worst experiences of his life. The rising pop-rock outfit, fresh off an Austin City Limits Festival performance, had just enjoyed a city-designated day on April 7, 2022, when, three days later, singer Daniel Sahad suddenly passed away. Soon after, his bandmates hopped onstage to perform a few songs at an Empire Garage memorial concert, led on vocals by Sahad's close friend and collaborator, Quentin Arispe of the Past Lives.

"We felt like we really had to [perform] and that the night wouldn't have been complete if we hadn't," Green tells the *Chronicle*,

looking back. "But that was probably the worst experience I've ever had onstage. I don't ever really want to break down and just sob in front of that many people and be that vulnerable in front of that many people ever again." (Citing Sahad's family's request for privacy, Green declines to share Sahad's cause of death.)

"It was really traumat-

ic," Arispe agrees. "I've seen Daniel perform so many times, but I never was watching thinking, 'One day, I'm gonna have to do that.'"

Two years later, the band returns to Empire on April 7, ready to celebrate Nané Day properly. Arispe once again fronts Green, bassist Scott McIntyre, drummer Jordan Espinoza, percussionist Gustavo Hernandez, and keyboardist Marcell Coleman for a full set of Nané songs – plus some surprises, the guitarist teases. Preparations for the show began late last year, when Green – who co-founded Nané with Sahad in 2016 as students at UT-Austin – realized it was getting easier to listen to the band again.

"I noticed [I could] hear Daniel's voice in these songs again and not completely retreat into myself," he recalls.

Comparing the process to taking on a role in a biopic, Arispe says, "We went through all of the songs. [Green] told me what Daniel's process was and why Daniel wrote it, what they were about. He really helped me understand them." Jefferson Clay, another longtime member of Nané's "musical community," opens the show. The Texas Ex recalls meeting Sahad in his very first university class, then later playing Kings of Leon and Foster the People covers with Sahad, Green, and Chris Collier before the duo began writing Nané's soulful funk-rock originals.

"I cried like a baby when Ian asked me to [open Nané Day]," Clay messages the *Chronicle.* "Dan touched everyone he came into contact with, and TRULY made their lives better. Everyone says that about loved ones they've lost, but Dan was different. He was a

supernova. I can't wait to celebrate him."

In between Clay and Nané's sets, Sahad's family will lead a celebration of the artist's life. Proceeds from the event, presented by KUTX, benefit the SIMS Foundation.

Though Arispe concedes "I'll never be Daniel," they hope their performance offers restorative celebration.

"Ian and all of us keep saying this one is for us. This is for the band. This is for our healing process," the vocalist says. "And getting to revive all of these songs?" They trail off, listing Nané titles. "It is really, honestly, some of the best Austin music that I've ever heard."

KB BROOKINS' SECOND FREEDOM HOUSE

Haters will call it confusing. Famously figurative, poetry remains the most discouragingly mystifying format in the literary sphere. But would those metaphors and similes be more digestible if they were presented in a picture?

KB Brookins investigates via "Freedom House: An Exhibition," a visual rendering of their 2023 poetry collection of the same name, opening April 13 at Prizer Arts and Letters. Based on their experience as a queer, Black, trans Texan, Brookins first conceptualized the book by reflecting on the ways in which art contributes to liberation. Speaking to the *Chronicle*, they recall pondering: "If freedom was a house, how can we make sure that art is one of the tools that builds the house?"

At Prizer, Brookins assembles said home by placing digital collages, inspired by specific *Freedom House* poems, in different "rooms," signified by corresponding furniture. Artworks range in topic from the surveillance of Black Americans to East Austin gentrification. Most moving is "Black Hair," which pairs a portrait of the artist with a poem about growing a beard for the first time.

"I saw myself over time – and I've talked to other trans men and transmasculine people about this – you can see the way that people treat you differently over time," Brookins says. "[There's a] bashfulness with growing any kind of hair that is not on your head when you're seen as a girl. I just had a whole new experience of hair."

Brookins will read select poems and take questions at the April 13 opening reception, which runs from 6 to 9pm. While no stranger to the publishing world – their debut memoir *Pretty* arrives May 28 – "Freedom House" marks their first visual art exhibit.

Ahead of their debut, Brookins quips, "[I'm] feeling ready for these things not to be something that just exists in a Google folder."




Urban Cultural Fest touched down at Auditorium Shores last weekend. Renamed from Urban Music Fest in 2023, the two-day event featured oldie favorites like human beatbox Doug E. Fresh and funk-gospel singer Bigg Robb – who donned a sparkling blue-and-gold suit while alternating between sexual serenades and prayer songs – while also emphasizing Afrocentric food and accessories. Most notable? Certified Country Lemonade, which served Arnold Palmers in pails; Ashy Legs BBQ, which topped mac & cheese with crushed sausage and brisket; and Mr. Catfish, whose proprietor Homer Hill co-founded the festival. Sponsor AIDS Healthcare Foundation added a community focus with free, on-site HIV tests.

Oblivion Access 2024 is canceled. Founded in 2017 by bookers Dusty Brooks and Dorian Domi, the music festival – first known as Austin Terror Fest – highlighted metal before expanding to include hip-hop, ambient, and experimental. Following a 2022 appearance by newly-local rapper Danny Brown, last summer's incarnation marked the organizers' biggest run to date, booking Krautrock veterans Faust, industrial metalheads Godflesh, and slowcore godfathers Duster across several Red River venues. The founders didn't provide a reason for the festival's cancellation, but axed their last event, a Mohawk booking for experimental act Oxbow, in November, citing low ticket sales.

Guy Fieri popped up at the Hancock Center Twin Liquors last Thursday to promote Santo Tequila, his collaboration with Sammy Hagar. The spiky-haired TV chef spent an hour signing bottles of the 2019-launched spirit and taking photos with fans who, based on images published by the *Austin American-Statesman*, went all out to imitate the infinitely memeable personality with wigs, sunglasses, and his iconic flame-adorned black button-up.

Front-Row Seat to a Celestial Show

Understanding the science behind April 8's total solar eclipse BY ROBYN ROSS

hen AISD Trustee Lynn Boswell tells friends why she's traveled to see multiple total solar eclipses, she explains that she's going to see "a hole in the sky with fire shooting out of it."

"It's magnificent and amazing," she says. "You just stand there in that darkness awed by it. Everyone is silent, watching together, and the birds and insects change what they're doing. The temperature drops. The stars come out. If you're up in a high place looking down, you might see a shadow race across the ground as it's coming toward you.

"It's unlike anything else. And then it's gone."

A total solar eclipse happens somewhere on Earth about every 18 months. But any given location experiences a total solar eclipse much less frequently – at roughly 375-year intervals, although it's been more than 600 years since the Austin area saw such an eclipse. This is why Austinites' opportunity to watch Monday's eclipse from their own backyard is so rare and valuable.

Total solar eclipses occur when the moon passes between the Earth and the sun, blocking the sun and casting a shadow over a narrow strip of land called the path of totality. The orbits of the moon around the Earth, and the Earth around the sun, are elliptical. But they're not on the same plane; the moon's orbit is tilted by five degrees to the Earth's orbital plane. A solar eclipse only can occur when the moon's orbit intersects with the Earth's orbital plane. This is why there's not a total solar eclipse every month at new moon.

If the sun, moon, and Earth align when the moon is closest to Earth in its orbit (and thus appears largest), those in the moon's shadow will experience a total solar eclipse. If they align when the moon is farther from Earth, viewers on Earth will see an annular solar eclipse, because the moon does not appear large enough to fully cover the sun. This type of eclipse, in which a ring of bright sun remains visible around the moon, is what Austin experienced last October.

Total solar eclipses are only possible because we live at the right moment in cosmic history. Eclipses happen because the sun is both 400 times larger than the moon and 400 times farther away. This means the two appear to be the same angular size in the sky. When the moon first formed, it was much closer to the Earth and would have appeared larger, had humans been alive to see it. But the moon's orbit has gradually been enlarging, moving away from the Earth about 1.5 inches each year. Millions of years from now, total solar eclipses will no longer occur.

Multiple ancient cultures left evidence that they were aware of eclipses, although they did not know what they were actually seeing. The Greek philosopher Anaxagoras, born in 500BC, was the first person known to explain eclipses as the result of the moon blocking the sun's light. Two thousand years before Copernicus propagated the heliocentric model of the universe, Anaxagoras was not aware of the orbital patterns that vielded eclipses. But, as astronomer and artist Tyler Nordgren explains in his book Sun, Moon, Earth, Anaxagoras understood enough to try to calculate the moon's size based on the shadow it cast during an annular eclipse in 478BC.

Scientists still confront unanswered questions during eclipses. Heliophysicists don't fully understand the structure of the sun's corona, or outer atmosphere, or know why the corona is hundreds of times hotter than the sun's surface. Eclipses present a rare opportunity for scientists to capture images of the entire corona from Earth to try to advance their knowledge.

A total solar eclipse is also the only time the corona is visible to the naked eve. Wait! You can look at the sun with the naked eye during an eclipse? Yes, but only if you are inside the path of totality, and only during the few minutes of totality, when the moon completely blocks out the sun. Every total solar eclipse begins as a partial eclipse, as the moon slides across the face of the sun. In Austin, this will start Monday at 12:17pm. During the entire partial eclipse, it is as dangerous to look at the sun as it is on a normal day. Even a quick glance

can cause permanent retinal damage. But once the sun is covered by the moon - in Downtown Austin, this will happen at 1:36pm and 9 seconds - viewers can remove their eclipse glasses. For the minute and 46 seconds of totality (again, in Downtown Austin), everyone can look up at the "hole in the sky with fire shooting out of it" - the moon surrounded by the corona.

If you didn't get a pair of ISO 12312-2 eclipse glasses, you can still experience the eclipse. You can watch indirectly by creating a pinhole camera, which proi-

ects the image of the sun onto a surface. Punch a tiny hole in a piece of paper and – with vour back to the sun - hold it over another piece of paper or posterboard. You'll be able to see the image of the shrinking sun projected onto the second paper. (Anything with a small hole will work, even a colander or slotted spoon.) Set your watch, or listen to people around you who have glasses, to know when

totality has begun. Then you can look up and enjoy the darkness until just before totality ends; set a timer to ensure you're looking away well before any sunlight emerges from behind the moon. If you're watching from near the edge of the path of totality, be especially care-

ful. Double-check the map (https://eclipse2024.org/ eclipse cities/statemap. html) if you're south of the river and east of I-35.

Eclipse chasers like Boswell describe the experience of a total solar eclipse as eerie but spectacular. "The two central emotions that everyone describes are awe and primal fear," writes Kate Russo, an Australian eclipse chaser who helps towns prepare for eclipses. Watching with a group tends to compound the awe, as one scream of delight engenders otharea saw such an eclipse. ers: the embedded video on Russo's site (https://

beingintheshadow.com/what-is-it-like). and the NPR video of the 2017 eclipse, "One Nation Under the Sun," capture the moment.

"It is such a beautiful shared experience," Boswell says. "The wonder of it connects and unites people. The idea of that coming to us, in our city, and having that amazing experience together is exciting."



"A Portal Through Time, Backwards and Forwards"

Waterloo Park hosts an eclipse-themed sculpture by Guadalupe Maravilla BY ROBYN ROSS

A new sculpture was unveiled this week in Waterloo Park to commemorate the total solar eclipse and Fusebox Festival's 20th anniversary.

Serpent of the Sun and the Moon, the bronze sculpture by Brooklyn-based Guadalupe Maravilla, represents a serpent holding two gongs, one for the sun and one for the moon. The piece is part of Maravilla's series called "Disease Throwers," sculptures that include a gong or ceremonial element that can produce a sound bath meant to cleanse and restore listeners.

Maravilla's artistic practice encompasses both sculpture and performances that Fusebox Co-Artistic Director Ron Berry characterizes as public rituals. For the 2017 Fusebox Festival, Maravilla presented BOOM! BOOM! WHAMMM! SWOOSH! in the central atrium of a state parking garage. A chorus of throat singers, the revving engines of a women's motorcycle club, and an audience invited to scream out its political frustration together created a cathartic roar that reverberated from the garage to the nearby Texas state Capitol.

Sound - whether from a gong or cathartic screaming - is a consistent element in the artist's work. Originally from El Salvador, Maravilla fled the country's civil war in 1984 as an unaccompanied 8-year-old migrant to the United States, where he eventually became a citizen.

In the 2010s, he was diagnosed with colon cancer and received chemotherapy as well as Indigenous healing practices, including sound baths, to assuage the side effects. He now offers periodic sound baths at venues in New York for undocumented people and cancer survivors.

Maravilla describes his work as reflecting the trauma of illness and migration as well as healing and rebirth. His sculptures fuse Mesoamerican symbols and mythology with contemporary political and human-rights issues.

"There's a quality to Lupe's sculptural work that, to me, feels both ancient and of the future," Berry says. "His work speaks the language of 'eclipse' - it is this portal through time, backwards and forwards."

Commissioned by Fusebox and Waterloo Greenway and installed in the park's Lebermann Plaza (near the intersection of Trinity and 12th), Serpent of the Sun and the Moon was activated in a sound bath ritual on Tuesday, April 2, and will remain at the park for several months. A second Maravilla "Disease Throwers" sculpture, Mariposa Relámpago, will be unveiled tonight (April 4) and remain through November at the Contemporary's Laguna Gloria campus. Maravilla will activate Mariposa Relámpago in sound baths for the public (Friday 7pm and Sunday 3pm) and for the cancer community (Sunday, 10am).



THIRD ANNUAL LYSISTRATA COMEDY FESTIVAL: THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM

Year three is definitely not the same as year one for most anything. (Toddlers, anyone?) For the 2024 Lysistrata Comedy Festival – running April 4-7 with all women and nonbinary performers – it's a wonder to behold the growth since its launch in 2022 with a quaint 36 performers in a single small New Orleans space.

The idea of an all-feminine festival is not new, but to build one with staying power? That's a feat. The All Jane Comedy Festival in Portland, Ore., was the longest running all-female comedy festival in the country but ended its 10-year run in 2023. Even the few women-centric comedy festivals in Austin haven't run more than two years. Will Lysistrata break the record in Austin – and the U.S.?

This year's festival brings 75 hilarious performers from across the country to grace the stages of ColdTowne, Hideout, and Rozco's Comedy Club. The festival's growth to three venues is due in large part to the increase in submissions year after

year. According to fest co-founder and Operational Director Denise Jena, "It's hard to reject perfectly good performers due to little other than the limits of time." Thinking ahead, Jena adds that next year Lysistrata will have to expand to a full week or possibly two consecutive weekends. All right: So we're already eyeing year four? Nice!

More performance spaces, performers, and workshops require not only a leap of faith, but hustle. Lead producer and founder Rochelle McConico – a 2023 Best of Austin Critics Pick for "Best All-Around Champion of Comedy" – gushes extreme gratitude for her team, composed of herself, Jena, Tiana Stuart, Blue, and Sarah Spear. "The truth is," she acknowledges, "without them this festival would not exist. It would be a thing Rochelle did one time." Without funny performers, Lysistrata wouldn't exist, either. "Every year," McConico says, "the basic tenet of the festival remains. We know a bunch of funny womxn and nonbinary performers and we want to see them shine."

Former Austinite and headliner Jasmine Ellis is guaranteed to shine brightly. Now based in Los Angeles, Ellis' second special *Nobody's Queen* won NPR's 2021 Bullseye Comedy album of the year. Ellis spent several years in Austin and recorded her 2019 debut album, *Trash Baby*, at Cap City Comedy Club. She'll record her third album during Lysistrata on April 5. Ellis chose to record at the festival not only because she felt ready to record about her recent experiences in the mental

> health system but also loved the idea of doing so at a festival she says is "bringing great voices and talent to Austin."

Y'all We Asian is Lysistrata's improv headliner, serving up laughs on Saturday from the femme and nonbinary members of the all-Asian troupe. Founded in 2017 by Yola

Lu and Kim Tran, Y'all We Asian regularly sells out its monthly show at Fallout Theater. This will be the troupe's first headlining spot and member Mary Vo is "thrilled to work with the wonderful organizers of Lysistrata, whose work in elevating the voices of women, queer folk, and people of color in creative spaces is so vital."

If you're imagining a festival brimming with scented candles, knitting, and silent meditations, don't worry: Lysistrata is boisterous, rowdy, and loudly generous in its celebration of the feminine voice. "The festival endeavors to celebrate womxn and do it with an in-your-face, tongue-in-cheek, sing it to the high heavens, tender, heart-centered kind of way," McConico says. No matter how you identify, it promises to be a good time and a grand celebration for women and nonbinary folks in comedy. – VALERIE LOPEZ

DAY TRIPS BY GERALD E. MCLEOD

Rocksprings balances on the edge of the wooded **Hill Country** and the brush land of the West Texas desert. The small town isn't really on the way to somewhere else, so you have to be heading there to discover its charms.

Edwards County wasn't organized until 1883 when 226 people lived there. In 1913 the county separated from Real County, leaving 2,120 square miles of rugged landscape. The county's population today is around 1,500.


As the only town of any size in Edwards County, Rocksprings became the county seat in 1891. The two-story, frontier-style courthouse was built of locally quarried limestone. The town is the supply depot for area ranches where the goats and sheep outnumber the humans more than 100 to 1. The county is one of the largest producers of **mohair and Angora wool** in the world.

On the courthouse square, the more-than-a-century-old Historic Rocksprings Hotel still offers a comfortable night's rest. There are only four restaurants in town. The chef at the **Lotus Thai Café** across from the courthouse moved to Rocksprings from Thailand.

The biggest attraction in Rocksprings is the **Devil's Sinkhole State Natural Area**, nine miles north of town. Access to the natural area is by guided tour only, and reservations are required. All tours to the sinkhole begin at the visitor center in Rocksprings. Call 830/683-2287 to reserve your spot.

In the evenings from May 1 to October 31, approximately 3 million Mexican free-tailed bats swarm out of the natural area's 50-foot-wide shaft that drops 140 feet into the sinkhole. The cavern itself has a diameter of over 320 feet and reaches 350 feet deep.

Rocksprings is about three hours west of Austin. Kickapoo Caverns State Park, South Llano River State Park, and Garner State Park are about an hour from the county seat of Edwards County.


CMT Music Awards Music sunday 7, moody center

Indeed, the band's latest, 2023's exceptional *Stories to Tell*, may well be their best. The Hangmen rarely venture beyond the West Coast, so this gig is a rare treat. Destroyer of Light Album Release MUSIC SUNDAY 6, HOTEL VEGAS


After 12 productive years, Austin metal mainstays Destroyer of Light have announced the end of the road. Like any good headbangers, though, they're not going quietly: The hard-rocking quartet leaves behind one final album, the expansive, genre-fluid *Degradation Years*, and will embark on a 17-city tour through the South, North, and Midwest in support. To kick off that jaunt, DoL celebrates their career at Hotel Vegas with a sort of "State of ATX Metal" sendoff, including stoner psych icons the Well, fellow subgenre-agnostics Transit Method, and newcomers Five Armed Swordsman.

Statesman Cap10K COMMUNITY SPORTS

SUNDAY 7, DOWNTOWN

The Cap10K is one of the most Austin things you'll ever do. You arrive at the Congress Avenue bridge around 7am on a bright and fresh Sunday morning (this year's forecast looks good!) to find thousands of friends and neighbors milling about, dressed in their gaudy running outfits. The race, such as it is, begins at 8 and the runners swarm north, taking over Congress Avenue. Then it's 6 miles of people-watching and good vibes and walking the streets and paths of Enfield and Lady Bird Lake. When you cross the finish line there will be photos, free massages, food vendors, and even booze. And beautiful people, people.

Reader, I must be real: I'm watching *30 Rock*, again. As a teen, my parents and I watched NBC Thursdays with religious commitment. To return has been a fascinating experience – or as my friend said, this 2000s comedy show is "funny to watch." While the modern urge in a rewatch is to cringe at every sharp-edged gay joke that pushes against the bumpers put up by squeamish suits on the bowling alley of entertainment, I prefer to see the off-color punches *30 Rock* threw as a chance to knock over a few pins I haven't touched in a while.

Why do many of the LGBTQ-specific jokes slung in 30 Rock's mile-a-minute comedic pacing make the modern viewer wince? Some say the difference is time: In 2024, you just can't make jokes about a sex freak starlet marrying her straight drag queen boyfriend who dresses as her for work. We're in too progressive a society for that. However, I'd argue the jokes didn't play in 2006 when the show first aired. Back in Aughts hell, the reason people shied from a show with so many pointed jokes about marginalized communities was because straight-cis-normie society refuses to bear anything that challenges the rippleless pool of its existence. Today, the deal is much the same despite increased queer visibility. To be honest, most mainstream LGBTQ content has the edge of safety scissors - dull and plastic, made to "protect" a conceptual queer viewer rather than facilitate the real community's advancement.

My issue in why 30 Rock - and most previous decades' incisive comedy that featured LGBTQ themes - doesn't work entirely comes not from the content but the creator. I'm not saying Tina Fey isn't funny or didn't make a great show, but a point of view sorely lacking in 30 Rock is the transsexual's. For how much Liz Lemon resonates in her baggy layered frumpery to the early transmasculine egg, how much more would the character hit were a real trans man able to contribute his own experiences into the narrative? 





Wolff In or Wolff Out? It's Complicated

Austin FC finally secured its first win of the 2024 season Saturday night, beating an injury-plagued FC Dallas 2-1 at Q2 Stadium. For Austin FC players and coaches, particularly head coach Josh Wolff, the moment allowed for a rare and refreshing break from the constant tension that exists when a club is failing to live up to the expectations of its supporters.

Until about midway through Wolff's postmatch press conference, that is.

That's when **Jorge Iturralde** of **Club Deportes** – a longtime critic and verbal sparring partner of Wolff – informed the fourth-year coach that a "Wolff Out" march, complete with a 10-foot-long banner, had taken place before the match. Wolff, as any embattled coach with half a brain would do, dismissed the question without comment, but not before falling back into the kind of guarded, tense disposition that has become his mantra during tough stretches for the club.

Though attendance for the **"Wolff Out"** march in question seemed to number more in the dozens than in the hundreds, it's clear to anyone who follows Austin FC that a sizable portion of the fan base has lost its patience with, and its faith in, Wolff. The odd win against a banged-up rival certainly won't be enough to alter those feelings.

Last October, longtime MLS voice and former Austin FC play-by-play announcer **Adrian Healey**, who at the time was still on the club's payroll as a host of the *Verde Lights* studio show, outlined the crux of the issue in a brutally honest tweet.

"By the global standards of modern pro soccer management, Josh Wolff is extraordinarily lucky to still be coach of Austin FC after 3 seasons in the job. A record of 37-52-21 after 110 [games] in all [competitions] would be fatal in 99% of cases," Healey wrote.

Following the ATXFC's loss to **Orlando City** on March 23, Healey, now no longer employed by the club, issued a cheeky follow-up, tweeting simply, "37-54-24."

Healey is right. Even when you factor in a stellar 2022 season that concluded with a trip to the Western Conference Final, Austin FC's all-time record under Wolff, frankly, sucks. So why is he still Austin's coach?

Only club majority owner **Anthony Precourt** – who rarely speaks on record – knows for sure, but we can infer.

First, to attribute Austin FC's mediocre record entirely to Wolff would be both ignorant and unfair, given the club's well-documented front office turmoil over the years. Former sporting director **Claudio Reyna** assembled a deeply flawed expansion roster in 2021, then abandoned the club in 2023 thanks to his "bad dad" antics at the World Cup, forcing Wolff into double-duty as both coach and GM. This season, new sporting director **Rodolfo Borrell**'s roster renovation project has left Wolff with a glorified skeleton crew to work with.

Second, and likely more importantly, Wolff's significance to Austin FC goes much deeper than the average coach/club relationship. Wolff isn't just Austin FC's first head coach. He's their architect – figuratively from an on-field perspective, but also literally; he helped design the club's training ground. His tactical principles aren't just employed by the senior team, they're coached at every level of the club's academy. Parting ways with Wolff would come at a cost.

Put another way, Wolff is Austin FC's first love. And sometimes, you stick by your first love longer than you probably should, because you want so badly for it to work out. But if Austin FC's win-loss record under Wolff continues to suffer, the club will have to come to grips with the fact that the first love rarely leads to a ring.



When I say that Zoé Tong has big DGAF energy, I don't mean that the chefs are careless or the front-of-house staff is negligent. Quite the opposite, in fact. But this new Chinese-ish restaurant on Barton Springs Road makes the risky choice to break with any and all easy definitions, to play around with influences and inspirations, and to focus on one central theme: the pursuit of fun.

It's a bold move, and it's one that could easily have failed in spectacular fashion. Luckily, Zoé Tong's gamble paid off, and this just-irreverent-enough spot deserves to be recognized as a Zilker dining destination.

Zoé Tong is the brainchild of Matthew Hyland and Simone Tong, two chefs who made a major impression on the NYC restaurant scene in the late 2010s. Hyland and Tong recently relocated to Austin with their family, and Zoé Tong marks their ATX brick-and-mortar debut. As a fellow New York expat who's loved every meal I've had at their East Coast restaurants, I couldn't wait to see how these chefs would translate their culinary successes to the Austin market and whether they'd be able to craft a dining experience that feels like a natural fit rather than an out-of-touch transplant.

There's an indelible lightheartedness about Zoé Tong's decor, but there's also something about the mixture of industrial touches – visible ceiling pipes, concrete floors, garagedoor windows – with whimsical tchotchkes, bright hanging lanterns, and neon signs that evoked vivid memories of my former life as an indie sleaze Brooklynite. Every time I glanced over at a banquette, I half-expected to see Zooey Deschanel in a vintage 1950s dress and Buddy Holly glasses waxing poetic about LCD Soundsystem. The overall effect is charming, if a little twee and more than a little millennial. But you won't find any hipster attitude in Zoé Tong's service style. At every one of my visits, the hosts, servers, and bartenders delivered genuine and helpful hospitality. When I asked for recommendations, each staff member was ready and able to talk about their favorite menu items in detail and with no hesitation (and without resorting to the dreaded "oh, I like everything!").

In fact, a server recommendation led me to the absolute highlight of my Zoé Tong experience: the Si Baby Verdad. The Zoé Tong cocktail menu focuses on classic libations with updates that allow Asian ingredients and flavor profiles to shine. While their take on the margarita includes the standard tequila and lime juice, they take the extraordinary step of clarifying the drink by milk-washing. This results in a silkier, smoother margarita, with an extra flavor boost from strawberry and shishito pepper infusions. But the crown jewel of the Si Baby is the foam floater on top, which brings a burst of tart yuzu and a hint of sea salt for balance.

Zoé Tong's menu changes on a regular basis based on seasonality and the chefs' inspirations. Family style reigns supreme here, with all dishes designed to share. In order to get a well-rounded sense of the menu, you'll likely end up ordering more food than one or two people can comfortably finish in one sitting. Groups of three or more would fare better, unless you – like me – happen to be a big fan of leftovers.

The appetizers do an effective job of easing diners into Zoé Tong's Texan-Chinese concept. The flaky scallion swirls bring the punchy vibrancy of scallion pancakes, but with a mellow flavor backbone and a crispyet-soft texture that reminded me instantly of Pillsbury crescent rolls. A swirl of sweet bean

sauce and a crock of truffle butter are seamless and appealing additions. Another noteworthy snack? The "Hot Legs," which Zoé Tong presents as its spin on chicken wings, only with fried frog legs swapped in for the usual poultry. If you're a frog leg skeptic, rest assured that the natural flavor of the meat is slightly sweet, a bit grassy, and a perfect complement for the seasoned panko breading and the smoked mayonnaise with tingly mala spice.

Speaking of mala, the wild boar and brisket dan dan noodles deliver plenty of that numbing sensation courtesy of a Sichuan peppercorn oil tossed with the springy noodles, deeply savory sauce with smoky brisket and tender boar, and poached quail eggs that bring a silky richness to the entire bowl. The Rice & Noodles section of the menu is also home to one of Zoé Tong's signature dishes: Zoé Tong fried rice, which features beautifully burnished rice, creamy heritage egg, crisp seasonal vegetables, and hearty chunks of Chinese sausage made in-house and teeming with tang, spice, and umami.

Zoé Tong uses its entrées to play around with common American concepts of Chinese dishes. There's a beef-and-broccoli dish with Wagyu steak and broccolini, a spin on Peking duck with a tea-smoked Rohan duck and duck confit, and a version of General Tso's chicken that replaces the typical cornstarch coating with panko and nods to Central Texas' German heritage with a schnitzel-style preparation. While I enjoyed the hefty crunch and the sweetspicy-tangy blend of the sauce, I found myself

missing the best part of standard takeout General Tso's: the delicate breading that allows the sauce to seep through, fully infuse the meat, and help the chicken pieces cling to the rice.

The dessert offerings at Zoé Tong are spare; only two options appeared on the menu during my visits. But that hardly matters when there's a clear must-order. which comes in the form of black sesame soft serve with raspberry pearls. Light, airv. yet luxurious, this ice cream's subtle profile includes gentle nutty notes and a sweetness that's never aggressive or cloying, and the raspberry pearls bring a balanced acidity and an engaging textural contrast.

Cynics can (and probably will) find plenty to whine about here. A "fusion" restaurant founded by New Yorkers with cutesy decor and fairly high prices? I can hear the virtual army of Austin Redditors sharpening their pitchforks from behind their screens. But they'd be missing the point. Zoé Tong doesn't take itself too seriously, but it takes its ingredients and flavors and inspirations seriously enough to create dishes and cocktails that feel unique, bold. and enjoyable. Zoé Tong wants to have fun, it wants you to have fun, and there's no reason for anyone but the most committed naysayers to not have fun at this restaurant.



higher if I'd had the chance to watch it again.) No matter: O'Connor is a first-class Jean-Paul Belmondo-like brooder, until something trips him up and he beams like a little boy. More often than not, it's Italia (Duarte), a sort-of lady's companion-slash-servant girl, who cracks his melancholia. Italia is a kook - she seems to process the world differently and find magic in surprise places - and the same can also be said for Rohrwacher, a true visionary.

Dream a Little Dream FILM

An Italian film about grave robbers is the year's surprise romance BY KIMBERLEY JONES

"The Englishman." Appropriately folkloric, that's what a troubadour in 1980s Italy dubs Arthur (O'Connor) in song. The exploits of the Englishman Arthur and his misfit friends are ripe for mythologizing: They're tombaroli, or grave robbers, digging in secret for ancient artifacts they can sell on the black market. An archaeologist gone rogue, Arthur is an outsider in Italy, but he's comfortable in this language and milieu; he's more or less fluent. He's less comfortable in this world - the land of the living. His fellow tombaroli are in it for the money. Arthur, meanwhile, is looking for a doorway to the dead.

Newly released from a short stint in prison - their pillaging of long-lost Etruscan tombs is illegal, after all - Arthur reluctantly returns to this merry band of thieves at film's beginning. (The grime of prison still on him, he clears a train car with his stink. La Chimera's first indication of a playful streak.) Arthur is not the tombaroli's leader; he's more like the talent. Divining rod in hand, he has a preternatural

intuition about where to dig. Is it because his purpose is higher? He is trying to find a way to the afterlife, a tether to his lost love Beniamina (Vianello). Arthur is haunted by her - the film opens with him dreaming of her, a dream he returns to often.

Does Arthur really believe he and Beniamina can somehow reconcile? Hard to say: Italian filmmaker Alice Rohrwacher's fourth narrative feature - a soft kiss of magical realism here, a Keystone Cops caper there is dreamily disorienting. On his dowsing rambles, Arthur falls to his feet when he senses buried treasure, in a literal swoon. I know the feeling: La Chimera had me swooning, too.

"Indelible" is the word I kept circling back to: not just in the sense of foreverness embedded in the story's setting - the relics they dig up, the centuries-old stonework they casually live among. It's the indelibleness of the images, too, the kind that fish-hook in vour brain and never leave vou, and not just

because they are pretty but because they are revealing, too. The out-of-season suit the newly freed Arthur starts the film in, telegraphing his out-of-timeness. A walk through a decrepit villa, where the help is dismantling a chair - probably priceless - and feeding it to a fire. The way two bodies become magnetized when they're thinking about kissing.

I'd say that O'Connor - late of Netflix's The Crown, soon to be seen in Luca Guadagnino's Challengers - delivers a star-making performance as Arthur, only I suspect not enough people will see Rohrwacher's arty, rapturous picture to give him the necessary juice. Rohrwacher's films, including The Wonders (2014) and Happy as Lazzaro (2018), perform better in Europe, where she's rightly acknowledged as a modern master. (Further, the film's puzzling distribution put it in front of international eyeballs and awards bodies last year, but American critics barely saw it. It made my top 10 list, and it would have jumped even

A sci-fi themed exhibit showcases early career artists

A dreamy exhibit titled "I Want to Believe" at Martha's opens with a lyric taken from Paul Simon's 1990 song "The Obvious Child":

Some people say the sky is just the sky But I say

Why deny the obvious...?

Gallery owners Meredith Williams and Ricky Morales use the lyric as the show's sole description, opting out of the usual comprehensive writeup that hand-holds

comprehensive writeup that hand-holds viewers through the meaning and contents of an exhibit. It's very fitting to me that the description comes from a song that, back when I first heard it, I both enjoyed and didn't understand.

"I Want to Believe" is a collaborative group show that combines the work of various emerging artists from two different galleries. Presenting four artists from Martha's stable and four artists from the Dallas contemporary art gallery 12.26, the full list of featured talent includes J.A Feng, Emily Furr, Calhan Hale, Julia Maiuri, Conner O'Leary, Hasani Sahlehe, Brach Tiller, and Wes Thompson. What unifies the show is not the medium or style of the artists, but instead is the theme that artists were instructed to explore. This came down to one nebulous keyword: "scifi." Intentionally vague, the curators chose the exhibition's concept with the desire to produce weird outcomes. Successful in their venture, the medley of distinctive artists all exploring "sci-fi" results in a peculiar and unexpected display.

Each piece is visually and stylistically different, yet tied together by originality. *Laundry Day* by J.A Feng portrays a scene of humanlike figures gleefully romping about in the machine and glimmering from the wash. Hasani Sahlehe's painting *San Gabriel* is an abstract colorful piece, textured with lime-green bubbly goop that brings aliens to mind. The sole sculpture is *Ghost Dog*, a skillfully constructed wooden canine constructed by Wes Thompson. Hanging from thin strings in the middle of the room is this precious scene of a sleepy dog, floating around like a friendly ghost.

My favorite piece is Conner O'Leary's surreal *Psychic Emissary*. A painting that

possesses an eeriness as well as a silliness, it depicts a mirror reflecting a pint glass that is levitating over a white marble table. Outside of the mirror frame, on the bottom right of the painting, is a charming scene of a tiny figure riding a tiny horse. The piece reminds me of Magritte with its shading and oddity. The experience of looking at it is reminiscent of the compelling confusion of taking in an optical illusion or an uncanny dream.

Altogether the talent on display is serious, but the collection's tone is playful and lighthearted, tickling the imagination without necessarily having a life-altering or self-important message. Walking through the two small rooms, you don't know what you're looking at or necessarily why, but the experience provokes a pleasant reaction. I like it when people communicate their weird ideas out loud; that's one of the main joys of consuming art. "I Want to Believe" does what an exhibit should do, which is expose you to intrigue, creativity, and talent. Whether or not it makes sense is beside the point.





Renting and Emotional Support Animals

I am trying to rent one of my properties. One potential tenant has an emotional support dog. What's the legal difference between an emotional support dog and a service dog? The tenant says that he doesn't have to pay a pet security deposit for the emotional support animal. Is that right?

As a general rule in Texas, landlords do not have to allow pets on the property. And landlords can require a pet deposit.

There are however exceptions to this general rule related to service animals and emotional support animals (FSA). Let's start by distinguishing service animals from an ESA.

The Americans with Disabilities Act and Texas law essentially define a service animal as a dog (or miniature horse) that is specially trained or equipped to help a person with a disability and is used by the person. Service dogs are specially trained to perform a specific task. There are many types of service dogs, including guide dogs (for visually impaired), allergy

detection dogs, and diabetic alert dogs. Service dogs have public access rights, which means they can go places where other animals aren't allowed

An ESA is an animal (dog, cat, bird, or other animal) that provides a comforting presence to its handler that helps to lessen the symptoms of a mental or emotional disability. In contrast to a service animal, which is trained for a specific task, an ESA's primary role is to provide an ongoing sense of comfort and security.

Federal and Texas law generally allow a person with disability, either mental or physical, to be provided fair and equal access to housing. The practical application of these laws means that renters can live with their FSAs, even in rental housing where nets are not tynically allowed, as long as the FSA is not aggressive and does not pose a physical threat. Landlords can request to see an ESA letter, which is issued after consultation with a licensed mental health professional and supports the need for the ESA. Owners of ESAs typically do not need to pay security deposits. The owner of the ESA would, however, be financially liable if the ESA damages the property.
